On March 31, trainer Todd Pletcher continued his recent stranglehold on Gulf-stream Park's marquee spring event, the \$1 million Florida Derby, winning the race for the fourth time in the last six years as Audible registered a popular and convincing three-length victory over the up-and-coming Hofburg in the Grade 1 Kentucky Derby prep. It was nearly eight lengths farther back to third-placed Mississippi.

By winning the Florida Derby, Audible earned 100 Kentucky Derby qualifying points, securing him a spot in this year's field. Runner-up Hofburg picked up 40 points, which puts him in 14th place on the points, a total that would historically give him enough points to make the Derby lineup if his connections so desired.

Audible broke well under jockey John Velazquez and quickly moved into good position approaching the clubhouse turn before easing back about a dozen lengths off a lively pace set by Fountain of Youth winner Promises Fulfilled and attended by Strike Power. Audible, making his first start since winning the Grade 3 Holy Bull in similarly impressive fashion eight weeks earlier, began to advance outside horses exiting the backstretch, rallied four wide to engage the leaders nearing the stretch, readily overtook Mississippi at the head of the lane and, after moving clear, was not seriously threatened thereafter.



Hofburg, making just his third career start, was taken in hand after the break to race near the rear of the nine-horse field for the opening six furlongs. He began to advance inside the winner leaving the half-mile marker, continued to remain in reserve around the second bend under patient handling by Jose Ortiz, came widest when finally roused nearing the quarter-pole, moved within striking distance upon settling into the stretch but proved no match for Audible while easily best of the others.

Remsen winner Catholic Boy, who went postward the second choice in the Florida Derby at 2-1 behind only the 8-5 Audible, raced in perfect position for nearly seven furlongs, attempted to match strides with the winner on the final turn, could not keep pace at that point, and weakened steadily to finish a well-beaten fourth.

Audible followed in the footsteps of Pletcher's three recent Florida Derby winners Constituion (2014), Materiality (2015), and defending winner Always Dreaming, who also went on to capture the 2017 Kentucky Derby. Pletcher also won this race in 2007 with Scat Daddy.

A New York-bred son of Into Mischief, Audible is owned in partnership by the China Horse Club International, WinStar Farm, Head of Plains Partners, and Starlight Racing. The Florida Derby was his fourth consecutive victory following a third-place finish in his debut against statebreds last fall at Belmont Park. He completed 1 1/8 miles over a fast track in 1:49.48 and paid \$5.20 to win.

"The race unfolded with the pace that we were hoping for and we wanted to get some position into the first turn, which he was able to do beautifully," said Pletcher. "Watching the race, I was a little concerned at the five-eighths pole because he started to drop back a little bit, but I could tell Johnny wasn't panicked. He kind of grabbed him up, and sometime midway down the backstretch he started to pick up horses and I

started to feel better and better. You could tell the pace up front had developed pretty swiftly, so you felt like those horses were going to start to come back at some stage."

Pletcher said he has no definite timetable set for getting Audible to Churchill Downs. He also has two other prime Kentucky Derby candidates currently in his barn at Palm Beach Downs, Louisiana Derby winner Noble Indy and Rebel winner Magnum Moon.

Trainer Bill Mott was happy with Hofburg's performance.

"We're very pleased," Mott said. "Naturally, winning would have been the only thing that would have been better. But he ran well and galloped out well. He took a lot of dirt and was very professional."

Mott said the Kentucky Derby would definitely be under consideration for Hofburg, a well-bred son of Tapit, who ran only once as a 2-year-old before winning his maiden in his 3-year-old debut going 1 1/16 miles here on March 3.



Trainer Jonathan Thomas had no excuses for Catholic Boy.

"He had a great set up," said Thomas. "Irad [Ortiz Jr.] said he thought he could go with Audible, but when he asked him he kind of not floundered, but he didn't really go anywhere. He just didn't show the turn of foot I was hoping for."

Trainer Donna Green Hurtak was confident her veteran Conquest Big E could compete with Kentucky Derby winner Always Dreaming and multiple graded stakes winner Irish War Cry if she could correct one issue.

"He's been having a little bit of a bad habit of hopping out of the gate and it's costing him a good position, which has cost him the other two stakes races he has run in," she said. "We did a little gate work with him trying to get him out of the habit and it's great when you're a trainer and things work."

Indeed, the gate work Hurtak did with Conquest Big E paid off handsomely on Mar. 31, as Conquest Big E made the front coming out of the chute under Jose Batista and led the rest of the way, winning the Grade 2, \$300,000 Gulfstream Park Mile by three lengths.

Always Dreaming, last year's Florida Derby and Kentucky Derby winner, chased Conquest Big E throughout and settled for second, 1 1/2 lengths ahead of Tommy Macho. Page McKenney, Mr. Jordan and Irish War Cry completed the order of finish.

It was the fifth win from 20 starts for

Conquest Big E, a gelding by Tapit owned by Daniel Hurtak, the husband of Donna Green Hurtak.

Troubled starts cost Conquest Big E in both the Fred Hooper, where he finished second to Tommy Macho, and in the Hal's Hope, where he was fourth to Economic Model.

"I knew he can run with these horses," Green Hurtak said. "He's a very, very talented horse; he's also a Tapit and they can be a little quirky and we're just pleased he got to [show] his ability today."

Conquest Big E ran a mile in 1:35.92 and paid \$26.20 to win.

Always Dreaming was making his first start since finishing ninth in the Travers Stakes last August at Saratoga. Under John Velazquez, Always Dreaming stalked Conquest Big E from second, but never made a dent in the front-runner's lead and was able to hold second.

"The winner was a horse I was a little concerned about getting loose; I was hoping someone else would put a little pressure on him," Always Dreaming trainer Todd Pletcher said.

"The main focus for us was just having a positive start, we didn't want to be the ones to send and put pressure on that horse. Hopefully it'll be something he'll move forward from for having the race."

The biggest disappointment in the race was Irish War Cry, who went off the slight favorite. He was following the winner from the middle of the backstretch to the top of the stretch but was eased by Jose Ortiz in the final furlong.

"He broke really well, he put me into a good position, but down the backside I was going four wide, I didn't want to be four wide," Ortiz said. "So I dropped in and followed Johnny and then I went to the rail and followed [Conquest Big E]. He was traveling well passing the half-mile, but when we went into the stretch he dropped the bit on me, got a little bit tired."

The trip may not have gone quite the way trainer Dale Romans drew it up on the chalkboard, but in the end it didn't matter as Coach Rocks rallied to run down Take Charge Paula and register a 1 1/2-length victory in the \$300,000 Gulfstream Park Oaks on Mar. 31.

After registering a wire-to-wire, eightlength maiden victory in her previous start and showing big speed in the morning in her subsequent works, it seemed likely Coach Rocks would either be on or with the early pace breaking near the inside in the 1 1/16-mile Oaks.

Instead, the rapidly improving filly found herself shuffled back to seventh position a quarter-mile into the race and well off a swift early pace set by the previously undefeated Eight Thirtyone.

Jockey Luis Saez had to steady Coach Rocks briefly near the inside leaving the half-mile marker, then angled her out for clearance on the second bend. Coach Rocks accelerated suddenly midway on the turn, came well wide while continuing her bid entering the stretch before collaring the tiring Take Charge Paula inside the sixteenth marker to win going away.

Take Charge Paula, the 2-1 favorite in the field of 11 3-year-old fillies, raced forwardly from the outset, was sharply roused to strike the front leaving the quarter pole, edged clear at the top of the stretch but proved no match for the winner.

It was another 10 lengths farther back to Princess Warrior in third.

Coach Rocks, a daughter of Oxbow who needed seven starts before breaking her maiden Feb. 16. is owned in partnership by Rick Pitino's RAP Racing, Roddy Valente, and West Point Thoroughbreds. She covered the distance in 1:44.63 over a fast track and paid \$7.60.

"Good horses overcome bad trips and win big races," Romans said. "I didn't expect her to be that far back, but I didn't expect the rider on the one horse (Eight Thirtyone) to go to the whip like that right out of the gate. She dropped down and saved ground. It looked like Luis (Saez) got stopped a little bit on the backside. He had to go around, but it all worked out. When she swung out and found her rhythm, I thought she would

grind them down because I knew she was fit and distance wasn't an issue."

Romans said he always felt Coach Rocks was a quality filly.

"Every time I've brought her over there I thought she would win," Romans said. "It just took her a while to figure out how good she is."

Romans said Coach Rocks would ship to his barn at Churchill Downs on Sunday to prepare for the Kentucky Oaks on March 4.

The Argentine-bred Hi Happy announced he is a marathon turf horse to pay attention to with a strong 2 3/4-length victory in the Grade 2, \$250,000 Pan American Stakes at Gulfstream Park on Mar. 31.

Receiving the exact stalking trip trainer Todd Pletcher and jockey Luis Saez drew up, Hi Happy overtook the front-running One Go All Go turning into the stretch and sped clear to get his seventh victory from 12 career starts.

It was his first victory since Dec. 12, 2015, when he won a Group 1 going 1 1/2 miles on turf in Argentina. This was his sixth start in this country, and second for Pletcher.

Hi Happy broke running with One Go All Go, but Saez took Hi Happy back to let One Go All Go, under Chris Landeros, have the lead. Hi Happy was within 1 1/2 lengths of One Go All Go through a quarter in 23.96 seconds, a half-mile in 49.21, six furlongs in 1:13.79 and a mile in 1:38.15.

Hi Happy took control turning in the lane and was never challenged. Hi Happy, a 6-year-old son of Pure Prize owned by La Providencia, covered the 1 1/2 miles over firm turf in 2:23.85 and returned \$6.80 as the second choice.

"It was exactly the trip we drew up,"

Pletcher said. "We felt like [One Go All Go] would go to the lead, we felt like we would be stalking him and just wanted to get into a comfortable rhythm. It couldn't have worked out any better."

One Go All Go finished second for the fourth time in his last five starts.

"Minor award again," trainer Scooter Dickey said. "He's a game horse. He's keeping us happy, we're not disappointed."

Classic Covey rallied along the inside to be third, and it was 1 1/2 lengths back to Sadler's Joy, the 9-5 favorite, in fourth.

Trainer Christophe Clement was happy to see his filly Lull out in front early in the Grade 3 Honey Fox Stakes at Gulfstream Park on Mar. 31. He was less than thrilled to see how fast Lull had to go to get there.

"When he went 45 for the half, I was worried a little bit," Clement said after Lull, under Jose Ortiz, had run a half-mile in 45.06 seconds in her first start in four months. "Good horses overcome stuff."

Lull was good enough to overcome the rapid early pace and hold on to a nose victory over the late-running Res Ipsa to win the \$250,000 Honey Fox at Gulfstream Park. It was a half-length back to favored On Leave in third.

The win was the fifth from 13 starts for Lull, a 4-year-old daughter of War Front owned and bred by Claiborne Farm and Adele Dilschneder.

Clement said he instructed Ortiz to get the lead if possible, otherwise sit second or third behind anticipated speed horses Team of Teams and Conquest Hardcandy. Lull ran an opening quarter in 22.44 seconds and a half in 45.06 while a length or so clear of those two. Lull continued to roll through six furlongs in 1:08.56, and had put away the other early pursuers.

Lull kept going even as Res Ipsa, who was last early, charged down the center of the course under Julien Leparoux. Fortunately, the wire came up before Res Ipsa could get there.

"They said she doesn't want you to take



a hold of her, so let her go," Ortiz said. "If they go too crazy sit third, but I felt like I could get there and I did get there and she relaxed well for me. I'm just happy she got her head in front at the wire."

Lull covered the mile in 1:33.14 and returned \$8.60.

"I think she's top class at six, seveneighths and she's good enough and generous enough to go a mile on firmer turf," Clement said.

Clement said the Grade 1 Just a Game at Belmont Park on June 9 is mid-season goal.

Res Ipsa, who hadn't started since winning a Churchill allowance last October, fell well off the pace before launching an eye-catching move in the stretch.

"I needed another half a jump," trainer Ian Wilkes said. "She finished last year on a high note, you always want to see them come back with a good effort."

Flamboyant snapped a 14-race losing streak stretching back more than two years and became a millionaire in the process as he got a "dream-come-true" trip to win the Grade 3, \$201,575 San Francisco Mile at Golden Gate Fields on Mar. 31.

The 7-year-old French-bred Peer Gynt gelding won for the first time since capturing the Grade 2 San Marcos Stakes at Santa Anita on Feb. 6, 2016. He was coming off one of the poorer races of his career when he ran sixth, beaten 11 lengths in this year's San Marcos on Feb. 3.

"We've had him since he was a 3-year-old, and we're very fond of him," said trainer Patrick Gallagher, who had no explanation for the poor effort in this year's San Marcos.

"After the last race, we couldn't find

anything wrong. He just didn't seem to fire," said Gallagher, who wondered if time was catching up with his star.

Jockey Julien Couton, who called the way the race was run "a dream come true," said his mount "was in the garden spot all the way."

Flamboyant was 10th early as Many Roses set a legitimate pace.

Couton kept him to the inside, sitting comfortably behind Editore while in the clear.

The inside was the place to be on the far turn as runners began to drift out and Couton began to move up unimpeded, saving ground to the quarter pole as Flamboyant moved up on his own.

It was a three-horse race as the field straightened for home, with Flamboyant on the rail, Editore, who had run third in the San Marcos, in the two path, and Many Roses in the three path.

With his clean trip, Flamboyant had the momentum and had plenty of room and clear sailing once past the temporary rail just outside the sixteenth pole. He completed one mile over firm turfin 1:36.15.

"He gave me a good run," said Couton, who added that he thought Flamboyant had enjoyed the going over Golden Gate's recently freshened turf course, which had just reopened Friday.

At the wire, Flamboyant was a neck in front of Editore, with Many Roses – third in last year's San Francisco Mile – 1 1/4 lengths back in third

"He got a terrific run," said Gallagher, who said that Flamboyant, who earned more than \$100,000 with a second and four thirds in seven starts last year, had been "acting like he always has in the morning" heading into the race.

The victory was worth \$120,000 for owners David Bienstock and Charles Winner. Flamboyant has now earned \$1,081,916 in a career spanning 34 races with six victories.

The last time he ran in a major dirt race, Thunder Snow didn't even make it a quarter-mile. The eyes of the racing world trained on Churchill Downs, Thunder Snow broke from the gate in the Kentucky Derby, ran a few strides, and decided not to participate. Throwing his head about wildly, he was pulled up by jockey Christophe Soumillon.

Thunder Snow might have stopped in the Derby, but there was no stopping him on Mar. 31 in the Dubai World Cup.

A year after Arrogate ran through the rain here to win, Thunder Snow, on a sweltering night, made it rain.

Despite breaking from post 10, and thanks to speedy North America totally blowing the start, Thunder Snow made it all the way over to a golden rail before hitting the first of two turns. He led after a quarter-mile, and he still led after 1 1/4 miles, clipping home a whopping 5 3/4 lengths clear of odds-on favorite West Coast, who had his chance at the winner but was farther behind him at the finish than he had been at the top of the stretch.

"Thunder Snow, he just ran them off their feet," said West Coast's trainer, Bob Baffert.

Baffert finished two-three, with Mubtaahij just a neck behind West Coast. In fourth was Pavel, and then came Forever Unbridled, Awardee, Furia Cruzada, Gunnevera, Talismanic, and North America.

Pavel was caught four wide on the backstretch and far turn, Unbridled Forever five paths off the fence; both ran well in defeat. Talismanic, the Breeders' Cup Turf winner who was trying dirt for the first time, stalked the pace but never really got in the fight

Thunder Snow ran 2000 meters in 2:01.38. That was a course record – the fourth dirt mark to fall on World Cup day on a track that was obviously very fast.

As Soumillon described his trip during a post-race press conference, Saeed bin Suroor, the longtime Godolphin trainer, strode into the interview room. Trainer and rider had been given the golden riding crops awarded victorious World Cup connections. Bin Suroor proudly brandished his before the media: "This is number eight!" he said.

Indeed, bin Suroor had seven World Cup wins before Thunder Snow; his first came with Almutawakel in 1999, one year after Baffert won his first World Cup with Silver Charm. While this glory was old hat for the trainer, Soumillon, the Belgian-born jockey who has wintered in Dubai for several seasons, needed nine tries to win his first World Cup.

Baffert, gracious in defeat, claimed his horses raced over a fair-playing track surface, but three of the five dirt races went to horses that led from the start, a fourth to a horse that pressed the pace and took over with more than a quarter-mile left to race, and running positions for the entire World Cup field scarcely changed through the entire homestretch. Mind Your Biscuits, who came from last in the Golden Shaheen, was the only horse to make up meaningful ground all night.

With North America out of the game, Thunder Snow was able to cross and clear with relative ease.

West Coast raced outside Thunder Snow, Mubtaahij behind him, but when Javier Castellano on the former and Victor Espinoza on the latter got to work on their mounts approaching the homestretch, Soumillon hadn't yet asked Thunder Snow.

"On the backstretch, I had a good feeling, like nobody could touch me at the time," Soumillon said. "When I came in the last turn I was really confident; I feel no one coming around me. In the stretch, I was hoping that it wasn't like last year in the Derby."

A year ago, finishing strongly in the UAE Derby, Thunder Snow had shied badly from the huge video board inside the track, his serpentine course nearly costing him victory. Quirky this horse can be, for sure, and no one ever could really figure out what caused his obstinate behavior in the Kentucky Derby, for which he looked a reasonable hope.

Thunder Snow went on to win the Group 1 Prix Jean Prat in July, and his flop last fall in the Queen Elizabeth II Stakes was softground related. He was shipped to Dubai for a winter campaign with the World Cup in mind, but his chances looked slimmer after North America beat him 5 1/4 lengths March 10 in Round 3 of the Al Maktoum Challenge. That day, North America stole off to a clear lead, but this time, with \$10 million on the line, it was Thunder Snow who found the front – and the pot of gold.

Thunder Snow is a 4-year-old homebred by Helmet out of Eastern Joy, by Dubai Destination. He won for the seventh time in 18 starts.

Benbatl arrived in Dubai last fall as a Group 3 winner at Royal Ascot earlier in the year who had shown ample promise. Benbatl will return to England in the coming weeks as a Group 1 winner expected to be part of Europe's leading turf races

On Mar. 31 at Meydan Racecourse, Benbatl scored a career-defining win in the \$6 million Dubai Turf at 1 1/8 miles on the Dubai World Cup program. The Dubai Turf was Benbatl's first win in a Group 1 and his fourth group stakes win.

Ridden by Oisin Murphy for Sheikh Mohammed's Godolphin Racing, Benbatl was always near the front in the one-turn race. Murphy positioned Benbatl behind Janoobi, who had a clear lead for the first seven furlongs.

Benbatl took command in early stretch, leading with about 300 meters to go. He was not troubled by his 14 rivals, winning by seven lengths over the Japanese shippers Vivlos, Deidre, and Real Steel, with the latter two in a dead heat for third. Promising Run finished fifth.

Benbatl was bred in England by Godolphin Racing and is trained by Saeed bin Suroor. Fifth in the English Derby last June, Benbatl won the Group 3 Hampton Court Stakes for 3-year-olds at Royal Ascot less than three weeks later.

Earlier this year at Meydan, Benbatl won consecutive stakes in the Group 3 Singspiel Stakes on Jan. 11 and the Group 2 Al Rashidiya Sakes. Benbatl was second to Blair House in the Group 1 Jebel Hatta Stakes on March 10 in a key prep race for the Dubai Turf.

Benbatl has won 5 of 12 starts. He earned \$3.6 million for the win in the Dubai Turf and has career earnings of \$4,168,238.

Hawkbill acted up before the start of the Sheema Classic at Meydan and nearly was scratched, briefly getting his foot caught up in the starting stalls.

He then put his foot down on nine rivals, winning by three lengths over Poet's Word after being permitted to race.

Last into the gate following his antics, Hawkbill was first out. And after being examined by the vet when he was backed out, Hawkbill and Buick backed up the pace and put the Sheema field to sleep.

One doesn't want to say a \$6 million race got stolen but go ahead – Buick committed theft.

"When he has an uncontested lead he is a dangerous horse," said Buick. "When I looked at the race beforehand I couldn't see any confirmed front-runners, I sort of did think in the back of my head if he did get things his own way he could be a tough nut to crack."

First, Hawkbill had to avoid cracking something on the starting gate.

Buick said his mount was restless in his stall, reared up, and briefly had a leg over the front of it. It would not have been surprising to see Hawkbill scratched.

But he started, and at the break, Hawkbill galloped along on the lead, while his main rival, Cloth of Stars, pitched a fit. Pulling so hard on the reins his head turned sideways, and fighting jockey Mickael Barzalona for every step, Cloth of Stars raced just behind Hawkbill resenting the restraint placed on him.

While Hawkbill strolled, Cloth of Stars roiled, and when it came time to kick, the fighting had taken its toll.

Hawkbill finished strong as Cloth of Stars just ran along, losing second by a neck to Poet's Word as Hawkbill came home three lengths to the good. In fourth was the well bet Japanese colt Rey De Oro, whose strong finish was blunted by the slow pace.

Hawkbill captured the 2016 Coral-Eclipse Stakes for his only previous Group 1, but the Sheema was his best win. He ran 2400 meters, about 1 1/2 miles, in 2:29.45 while winning his 10th start from 20 races.

Hawkbill raced in Canada last year, finishing second in the Northern Dancer Stakes at Woodbine, and is an Americanbred 5-year-old, a son of Kitten's Joy and Trensa, by Giant's Causeway.

Chad Summers, the trainer and co-owner of Mind Your Biscuits, was asked just before the Group 1, \$2 million Dubai Golden Shaheen on Mar. 31 if his horse was as good as he'd been a year ago, when Mind Your Biscuits won the Shaheen by three lengths.

"He's better," Summers said.

Was that possible? Mind Your Biscuits had lost four races in a row. He had struggled last summer at Saratoga, and while he'd been second to Sharp Azteca in the Cigar Mile to end his 2017 campaign, he'd been beaten more than five lengths. Mind Your Biscuits even lost an allowance race Feb. 9 at Gulfstream Park while prepping for the Shaheen.

Forget all that. Maybe Mind Your Biscuits wasn't better, but he was at least as good.

Last of eight around the turn and still many lengths behind the leader at the top of the Meydan homestretch, Mind Your Biscuits flew home under Joel Rosario and beat X Y Jet by a head. Finishing another three-quarters of a length back was Roy H, the champion sprinter last year in the U.S. who saw his three-race winning streak snapped.

Mind Your Biscuits (\$10 to win) ran 1,200 meters, or about six furlongs, in 1:10.12, the third Meydan dirt-track record on the card

Not only did Mind Your Biscuits manage to get up, he did so after breaking poorly from post 1 and rallying wide on a track that appeared to favor speed. Did Summers fear the apparent bias as post time for the Shaheen approached? "Yeah, big time," he said

But Mind Your Biscuits burst a big hole in the bias. Already last a few strides out of the gate, Rosario guided him to the outside to avoid the worst of the notorious Meydan kickback. Up front, the local horse Jordan Sport was putting on a spectacular speed display, crossing over from an outside post to outrun the wickedly fast X Y Jet for the lead. Emisael Jaramillo switched X Y Jet outside, and the pace battle was on, the leaders whipping down the backstretch and into the turn.



Roy H, who got away from the gate even worse than Mind Your Biscuits, stalked the pace on the outside and ranged up to engage the leaders entering the stretch. X Y Jet put away Jordan Sport after straightening for home, and as Roy H failed to gain much on the leader, X Y Jet briefly looked like a winner.

"Once he opened up, I'm like, 'I'm gone,' " said trainer Jorge Navarro.

No sooner had the thought crossed his mind than Navarro saw Mind Your Biscuits descending. Rosario said he had no choice but to be patient after the poor start, confident his horse would deliver the same kick that won them the 2017 Shaheen. Mind Your Biscuits finally got out of last midway around the turn, really started coming to the front-runners after turning for home, and ran at X Y Jet until he caught him a couple strides before the finish.

It was a tough beat for X Y Jet and Navarro, made more so because the same thing had happened in the 2016 Shaheen, where X Y Jet was beaten a neck by Muarrab. Still, X Y Jet has been through two knee surgeries since that race and has still come back strong.

"You can't ask for more from him," Navarro said.

Kent Desormeaux, Roy H's jockey, told trainer Peter Miller it was as if Roy H's back leg locked as he tried to push off at the start.

"He stumbled bad behind," Desormeaux said. "He was eight lengths back after one jump. He made up five in a quarter of a mile, and I elected to sit chilly there to wait for the run for the wire. Then, I'm sure accidentally, he got spanked across the head by a neighbor jockey. It was just too much for him to overcome."

Mind Your Biscuits overcame everything. A 5-year-old horse owned by a partnership, Mind Your Biscuits ran his record to 7-8-3 from 20 starts and bumped his earnings above \$3.7 million while becoming the first horse since Caller One in 2002 to win consecutive Shaheens.

At the last minute, Jungle Cat became Godolphin Racing's best hope for the Group 1 Al Quoz Sprint at Meydan Racecourse. The 6-year-old veteran lived up to late expectations.

Jungle Cat was one of three Godolphinowned runners in the \$1 million Al Quoz Sprint on turf, a team that shockingly became two hopefuls when favorite Blue Point was scratched as the field was being loaded for the six-furlong race. Blue Point was reported to have had blood in a nostril.

Jungle Cat was patiently ridden by James Doyle to give the horse his first win at the highest level. He took the lead in the final quarter-mile and held off a late run from Stormy Liberal to win by a half-length. Conquest Tsunami, who set the early pace, held third, beaten a length.

Stormy Liberal and Conquest Tsunami are trained by Peter Miller in Southern California. Stormy Liberal won the Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint at Del Mar last November. Conquest Tsunami won the Grade 3 Daytona Stakes on the hillside turf course at Santa Anita on Feb. 24.

Doyle positioned Jungle Cat to the outside of Conquest Tsunami midway through the race on a straightaway turf course. Jungle Cat closed steadily to reach the front with about a furlong remaining. Doyle said Jungle Cat was not threatened by Stormy Liberal, who closed with interest on the inside of the track.

"He was away from me a little bit," Doyle said of Stormy Liberal. "I was never concerned."

Doyle said Jungle Cat was not fully exerted at the finish.

"He got to the front and shut down a tiny



bit." he said.

Washington D C, who finished eighth in the BC Turf Sprint last November, finished fourth.

It was Jungle Cat's third consecutive appearance in the Al Quoz Sprint, preceded by fourth-place finishes in the last two years. Trained by Charlie Appleby, Jungle Cat has won 7 of 30 starts and earned \$1,525,488. He was bred in Ireland by Sheikh Mohammed's Darley Stud.

Earlier this year, Jungle Cat won two races at Meydan – the Group 2 Al Fahidi Fort at seven furlongs on turf and the \$200,000 Nad Al Sheba Turf Sprint at six furlongs on turf March 10.

Aidan O'Brien said before the UAE Derby that Mendelssohn is the horse best

suited to the Kentucky Derby that he's ever trained. He's surely not saying anything different now.

Mendelssohn made his dirt debut in the Grade 2, \$2 million UAE Derby on Mar. 31 at Meydan and won almost from Dubai to Kentucky.

And Kentucky, all being well, is where Mendelssohn is headed as an intriguing horse for the Kentucky Derby on May 5 at Churchill Downs.

Sent hard to the lead by Ryan Moore on a Meydan dirt track once again favoring speed, Mendelssohn rolled down the backstretch in front, cruised around the far turn still in control, and then really started his show in the homestretch. Turning for home a few lengths in front of the filly Rayya, Mendelssohn bumped his lead to five lengths, then 10, 12, and 15, and he crossed the finish 18 3/4 lengths in front of Rayya, stopping the timer in 1:55.18 for 1,800 meters, about 1 3/16 miles. The time was a dirt-track record and was 2.27 seconds quicker than the next-fastest UAE Derby since Meydan went to dirt in 2015.

Even accounting for a track bias, the performance seemed exceptional. Reride, a decent if not elite American colt in his own right, was beaten more than 20 lengths.

"Ryan was always in a different race than the rest of us," said Pat Dobbs, who rode Rayya.

The highly regarded Gold Town, whose connections had Kentucky Derby aspirations, finished a distant fourth.

"We had a good position and moved up to the winner around the final turn, but I just wasn't good enough," said Gold Town's jockey, William Buick.

The UAE Derby is a major qualifying race for the Kentucky Derby, but only Mendelssohn, who got 100 points, is likely to start. Rayya got 40 points, but while the filly is headed to the U.S. to be trained by Bob Baffert, her connections have the Kentucky Oaks as a goal.

Is Mendelssohn good enough to run with the best American dirt horses? That's a question that will be asked regularly the next five weeks. "Yes," does not appear to be out of the question. Mendelssohn is by Scat Daddy and out of Leslie's Lady, the dam of dirt champion Beholder. He has enough quality to have finished second in the Group 1 Dewhurst Stakes last fall before winning the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf, and before coming to Dubai, he got in a tightener, winning an all-weather stakes at Dundalk in Ireland.

"He's got the pedigree, and he's got the instinct to perform," Moore said. "He's a



very exciting horse. Obviously, the next time it's going to be a little different. I still feel that he will get better."

O'Brien likes to send his horses late in the game to major races, and the Derby, in which O'Brien has run five horses, his best finish a fifth, will be no different. O'Brien said he'll ship Mendelssohn as late as possible to Churchill Downs, and Mendelssohn will do all his major work for the race at Ballydoyle, O'Brien's stables in Ireland.

Americans will get only a few days to see firsthand how this colt looks in the leadup to America's biggest race, and to decide whether he could actually win the thing.

Leave it to jockey Christophe Soumillon to sum up the nature of Vazirabad in one efficient phrase.

"My horse saw the horses in front of him, and he just wants to catch them," Soumillon said.

Wants to, and usually does. On Mar 31 at

Meydan, Vazirabad came from the back of the pack with a mighty blast and cut down those horses in front of him. Buzzing to the front with about 100 meters to run, he won the \$1 million Dubai Gold Cup for the third year in a row. No other horse has won a World Cup race three years running.

Vazirabad ran the 3,200 meters, about two miles, in 3:17.92, a course record. Favored as he should have been in North American wagering, he paid \$4.60 to win.

Two years ago, Vazirabad came to the Gold Cup fresh and won, but the last two seasons trainer Alain de Royer-Dupre has sent him here to prep in the Nad Al Sheba Oaks. Both times, he has lost that race, and both times, it has served its purpose.

"Alain did a good job again," Soumillon said. "He knows how to bring him 100 percent fit, and you can see today he is a different horse. It was a great moment to do it three times in a row."

Frontiersman, chased by Red Galileo, went hard on the front end, opening several lengths on the rest of the pack as Vazirabad settled in 14th of 16, a perfectly fine spot for a gray gelding of modest stature who burns with desire and can burn through his final quarter-mile, even at the end of a two-mile race. Vazirabad loomed into contention at the top of the stretch, and even when Soumillon had to alter course, it was clear he'd get there.

"When you come every year to Dubai, you learn what you have to do because it's very hot, and you have to not train them too much," Royer-Dupre said. "You have to know the place."

Vazirabad knows it, and since he is a gelding, if all goes well, he will return to try to win his fourth Gold Cup in 2019. Owned by the Aga Khan, Vazirabad is a 6-year-old by Manduro. His record now stands at an excellent 21-14-5-0.

A fine second, beaten one length after Vazirabad took his foot off the gas, was the venerable 9-year-old gelding Sheikhzayedroad, who was making his fourth start in this race. Rare Rhythm finished a neck farther back in third, and Frontiersman held valiantly for fourth.

The internationally renowned jockey Ryan Moore often can be found in the winner's circle following a million-dollar race, and there he was on Mar. 31 at Meydan Racecourse following Heavy Metal's two-length win in the Group 2, \$1 million Godolphin Mile.

Trainer Sandeep Jadhav? He'd never won a race of any sort, much less a seven-figure one, until the Godolphin Mile.

Jadhav was an assistant to trainer Salem Bin Ghadayer, and when Ghadayer got a one-year suspension for a drug positive earlier this month, Jadhav took over the stable.

"He broke out very nice, and I said, 'Oh,

this is my race," Jadhav said.

Regardless of the human at the helm, it was business as usual for Heavy Metal, an 8-year-old gelding who won for the eighth time in 19 starts at Meydan while racing for the 59th time in his career. Heavy Metal came into the 2017 Godolphin Mile in great form but floundered on a wet track, beaten more than 20 lengths. This winter, he won the Group 3 Firebreak Stakes by almost 10 lengths, but his race March 10 in the Burj Nahaar was subpar, a fourth-place finish after leading into the homestretch on a track carrying speed.

This time, Heavy Metal didn't stop at all. Breaking from post 9 under Moore, who was riding Heavy Metal for the first time, the gelding jumped sharply with a notion to make the front and get inside.

"He did jump well, but I still had to work very hard to get across," Moore said.

Outgunning Capezzano for the coveted rail spot, Heavy Metal took pressure throughout the race but always traveled well. He shook off his pace rivals with about 300 meters left to race and crossed the finish much the best, stopping the timer in 1:36.21 for the 1,600 meters.

"He's always been a brave horse, always runs very well here. I was lucky to get the ride on the day," Moore said.

Heavy Metal paid \$9.80 to win in North American pari-mutuel wagering. The gelding, owned by Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid al Maktoum, is by Exceed and Excel and out of Rock Opera, by Lecture.

Muntazah, a longshot trained by Doug Watson making his dirt debut, ran well for second, finishing a half-length in front of third-place Adirato, from Japan, with Musawat fourth. The Chad Brown-trained Economic Model, who is to remain in the Middle East with trainer Nicholas Bachalard and was the 5-2 favorite, never really got involved and finished seventh.
