Mike Smith, genuine awe in his voice, kept coming back to the same phrase as he walked down the tunnel and past the walking ring after he rode Justify to a victory in the Santa Anita Derby on April 7.

"He's just so talented," Smith would begin, and then point out something Justify has done in his brief career to back up that sentiment – winning a major race against a stalwart like Bolt d'Oro in only his third career start, in his stakes debut, and on a main track that was fast but

tiring. Over and over, Smith would return to that phrase, "He's just so talented."

Consider this: it was only on Feb. 18 that Justify made the first start of his career. That was three weeks before Bolt d'Oro, already a two-time Grade 1 winner, would make his 3-year-old debut and his fifth career start. Yet in less than two months, and in only his third start, Justify turned back Bolt d'Oro in the Grade 1, \$1 million Santa Anita Derby, a performance that will send both to Churchill Downs on May 5 as major players for the Kentucky Derby.

That's raw talent.

Justify no doubt benefitted by getting an uncontested lead, but he was giving away plenty of experience to Bolt d'Oro, and he held Bolt d'Oro safe through the lane for a three-length victory in the West's major prep for the Kentucky Derby, a win worth 100 points to guarantee Justify a berth in the 20-horse Derby field. It was a satisfying result in that both colts showed up and ran

well, were well clear of everyone else, and confirmed that they have the bona fides.

"If he moves forward off this like he should, he'll be tough," Smith said after Justify completed 1 1/8 miles in 1:49.72 over a dull track and earned a career-best 107 Beyer Speed Figure.

"A mile and an eighth is pretty testing for a horse who's just run twice," Smith said. "He's really talented. That's a really good horse trying to catch him."

Indeed, Bolt d'Oro was coming off a victory via disqualification in the San Felipe four weeks ago, and he ran his typical courageous race.

"Very good race, best horses in the country," said his jockey, Javier Castellano. "Second-best today. There will be more speed in the Derby."

Justify, the 9-10 favorite, used his natural speed to get to the top in 23.96 seconds for the opening quarter, then led through a half in 47.85 seconds and six furlongs in 1:12.61, with Bolt d'Oro about three lengths

back down the backside.

"Going to the turn I let him go with his big, long legs," Smith said. "Bolt d'Oro has a big turn of foot. I didn't want to get caught off guard."

Bolt d'Oro tried him but Justify repelled Bolt d'Oro. Justify drifted out a bit into the lane, and Bolt d'Oro dived back inside him, but Justify kept to his task and never let the result be in doubt.

"This should really move him up," said Bob Baffert, who trains Justify and was winning the Santa Anita Derby for a record eighth time. "The track's a little deep today. He does it effortlessly. He's still learning. He's a beast. I'm just glad I have him."

Bolt d'Oro finished six lengths clear of third-place Core Beliefs.

Bolt d'Oro came back to be unsaddled with a cut on the back part of his right front foot, an injury euphemistically known as "grabbing a quarter." His owner and trainer, Mick Ruis, saw it and thought it was minor but was going to immediately

address it at the barn.

Ruis was eager for a rematch in the Kentucky Derby.

"There definitely will be more pace in the Derby," Ruis said, adding he believes Justify "won't get an easy lead like today in the Santa Anita Derby."

Ruis also said he thought Bolt d'Oro might have bit a tad dull today owing to a hard race in the San Felipe.

"Maybe the San Felipe took a little out of him," he said of Bolt d'Oro.

Justify, a son of the late Scat Daddy, is owned by a partnership that includes China Horse Club, Head of Plains Partners, Starlight Racing, and WinStar Farm. He was a \$500,000 yearling purchase, and he earned \$600,000 for his win in the Santa Anita Derby.

Justify is now perfect in three starts. He beat maidens sprinting on Feb. 18, then on March 11 beat a first-level allowance field going 1 1/16 miles.

Monomoy Girl is a quietly confident filly. She walked through the crowded paddock at Keeneland on April 7 without turning a hair or breaking a sweat. She gives her trainer the same feeling.

“Confident,” said conditioner Brad Cox, when asked to describe his feeling as Monomoy Girl cruised down the backstretch in command of the Grade 1, \$500,000 Ashland Stakes. “Not worried.”

Monomoy Girl backed up that confidence with a 5 1/2-length win, picking up another 100 points toward the Kentucky Oaks, for which she will be among the favorites. A neck away from being unbeaten in her career, the filly, who has shown multiple dimensions when the necessity arises, is already a stakes winner at Churchill Downs – putting Cox in an enviable position for the filly classic after giving him his first Grade 1 victory.

“It’s special,” Cox said. “It means a whole lot that we’ve had her since the start. She’s really developed – we thought a lot of her when she started winning on the dirt last year at Churchill, and she’s obviously taken it to the next level.”

Monomoy Girl, the 3-to-10 favorite in the small field of seven, was away alertly from the rail under Florent Geroux, quickly established command of the race, and clicked off an opening quarter of 24 seconds and the half in 47.98. The outcome was never in doubt from there, as the filly began extending her margin over the field around the far turn and poured it on in the lane. She stopped the clock in 1:43.74 for the 1 1/16 miles on a fast track.

“We just wanted to take a good position and let the filly be comfortable,” Geroux said. “We had the rail, and we just took it to them, and she was the best. She can go farther.”

Eskimo Kisses, who was last as the field approached the quarter pole, turned in another powerful rally to be second, picking up another 40 points toward the Oaks. The filly had just missed in the Grade 2 Fair Grounds Oaks in her stakes debut two weeks ago, rallying to be second to long-shot Chocolate Martini by a head.

“She doesn’t always show a lot of speed in her races, so she was sitting back there biding her time,” said Corey Lanerie, aboard Eskimo Kisses. “When it was time to go, I called on her and she gave me every-

thing she had. I think more ground [in the Oaks] would be a whole lot better for her. That and maybe a little more pace up front in the race. We’ll see what happens.”

Monomoy Girl, a daughter of Tapizar, races for Michael Dubb, Sol Kumin’s Monomoy Stables, The Elkstone Group, and Bethlehem Stables. The filly has won 5 of 6 career starts, with the only blemish a neck defeat in the Grade 2 Golden Rod Stakes last November at Churchill Downs.

The filly previously won the Rags to Riches Stakes at Churchill. In her 3-year-old debut in the Grade 2 Rachel Alexandra, she overcame a poor start in which she trailed the field after hitting the gate to post a handy win despite also shying at the eighth pole.

On a day devoted to finding the next 3-year-old route sensation, a star was born in the older male sprint division.

The 4-year-old Army Mule, who had made just two starts before April 7, put in a scintillating performance, winning the Grade 1 Carter Handicap by 6 1/4 lengths over Awesome Slew at Aqueduct. It was 3 1/4 lengths back to Great Stuff in third. On a track that yielded slow times most of the day, Army Mule, the second choice, ran seven furlongs in 1:20.94. It was the fastest Carter since Forest Danger won this race in 1:20.54 in 2005. Like Forest Danger, Army Mule is trained by Todd Pletcher.

"I don't think the track's that fast today; for him to go 1:20-and [change], he's something really special," said Pletcher, who

has won this race three times.

Army Mule, a son of Friesan Fire owned by Vinnie Viola's St. Elias Stable, won his debut last April 30 but developed a problem in a knee that forced him to the sidelines. He didn't return to the races until January at Gulfstream Park, where he romped to victory in an allowance race. The Carter became the target after that despite the fact he was conceding experience to many solid horses.

"We felt good coming into the race, my biggest concern was this was only his third start and he was giving up a lot of seasoning to a lot of horses," Pletcher said. "He had shown us he deserved the chance and it worked out."

Breaking from post 2 under Joe Bravo, Army Mule took up a stalking position behind Red Dragon Tattoo and Green Gratto, and inside of Skyler's Scramjet. Red Dragon Tattoo and Green Gratto ran a half-mile in 44.93 seconds.

Bravo, noting that the majority of the dirt races were won by horses coming down the outside paths in the stretch, tried to get Army Mule to the outside. But there was no chance to do that.

When an opening presented itself turning for home, Bravo guided Army Mule on through and in a matter of three strides Army Mule exploded to the front. Bravo put Army Mule in the middle of the track in the final three-sixteenths and was never threatened.

John Velazquez knew Army Mule was a good horse having ridden him to victory in his debut. He could not ride Army Mule in his second start, and Velazquez's agent, Angel Cordero Jr., had already given trainer Mark Casse a commitment to ride Awesome Slew in the Carter.

Awesome Slew, seventh early, rallied widest of all in the stretch and while he finished a clear second he was no match for the winner.

"He had a good trip, I ran into a monster, Velazquez said. "We knew this for a long time. I told Angel 'I think that's a serious horse.' He showed it."

In the last three weeks, owner Jeff Bloom has gone to Dubai for work and then Russia for play, flew home to California, went racing in New Orleans, scouted 2-year-olds in Florida, returned to Dubai, then came back to California for a 2-year-old sale.

But the place he most wanted to be on April 7 was right where he ended up. Bloom was in the winner's circle at Santa Anita following the Grade 1, \$401,380 Santa Anita Oaks after the victory of his filly Midnight Bisou, and as Bloom let the moment wash over him, the reality that he had won the biggest race of the meet for 3-year-old fillies, and had a top prospect for the Kentucky Oaks, left him – almost – without words.

"This is a rare moment for me. I'm speechless," said Bloom, a former jockey who is the managing partner of Bloom Racing and also does broadcasting work for HRRN. "I can't believe I just won the Santa Anita Oaks."

Midnight Bisou confirmed her status as the best 3-year-old filly on the West Coast, and as a major player for the Kentucky Oaks on May 4 at Churchill Downs, with an emphatic 3 1/2-length victory over Spectator in a race worth 100 points for first and 40 for second toward a berth in the Kentucky Oaks. It was another 3 1/2 lengths back to third-place Thirteen Squared.

The main track was fast, but dull. Midnight Bisou completed 1 1/16 miles in 1:44.79.

Midnight Bisou, ridden by Mike Smith, lagged well off the pace, then cut loose on the far turn with a rally that took her from eighth to first in about a quarter-mile. She drew clear from Spectator in the final furlong.

"The amount of ground she made up was amazing," Smith said. "Even though I was that far back, I was very confident. She was back there, comfortable and happy. What a turn of foot she had."

Midnight Bisou (\$3.20) was favored after winning the Grade 2 Santa Ynez and Grade 3 Santa Ysabel earlier this meet, both after Smith became her rider.

She has now won 3 of her 5 starts after beginning her career with two nose losses, one in a stakes race. She's basically two noses away from being unbeaten. She has career earnings of \$450,000.

"She's special," said her trainer, the respected local veteran Bill Spawr, who will be running a horse in the Kentucky Oaks for the first time.

Midnight Bisou, a daughter of Midnight Lute, is owned by Bloom Racing, Chuck and Lori Allen, and Andrew Yaffe, who has

been an investor in Bloom Racing since its founding seven years ago.

Spawr credited the owners with Midnight Bisou's success, saying they were patient in letting her wait until October to make her debut after buying her at auction one year ago for \$80,000.

"It's a great partnership," Spawr said. "They were very patient with us."

In a closely matched renewal of the Grade 1 Madison at Keeneland on April 7, in which nine of the 10 starters were graded winners and favored Lewis Bay went off as a narrow 3-1 choice, the race fittingly came down to a blanket finish that Finley'sluckycharm took by a nose.

The top four finishers in the Madison – with Miss Sunset, Lewis Bay and America Gal following Finley'sluckycharm – were separated by merely a neck, with another filly, the hard-charging Salty, not far behind in fifth, beaten three-quarters of a length for all the money.

Finley'sluckycharm did more than show courage to win a tight photo by a nose. She also threw down from the start in a speed-laden field, pressing American Gal, the 2017 Test winner, as that one established hot fractions of 21.96 seconds for the first quarter-mile and 44.31 for the half over a fast track. Lapped on the outside of that rival, Finley'sluckycharm inched in front turning into the stretch, and maintained a narrow advantage down the lane as off-the-pace rivals gradually closed the gap.

"She's one of the special fillies," said Brian Hernandez Jr., her jockey for 11 consecutive starts. "The faster she goes – she just kind of runs horses off their feet, and that's what she did today."

A 5-year-old daughter of Twirling Candy owned by Carl Moore Management, Finley'sluckycharm raced seven furlongs in 1:22.82, notching the first Grade 1 victory of a 15-race career over which she has now

won 10 starts. She paid \$13.80 to win.

“She’s been so deserving of a Grade 1,” said trainer Bret Calhoun. “So happy to get it here at Keeneland.”

She rebounded from a couple of rare defeats – a ninth in the Breeders’ Cup Filly and Mare Sprint and then a second in the Mardi Gras Stakes, a turf sprint in February at Fair Grounds that was designed to give her a needed comeback to kick off her year.

Vino Rosso finally showed everybody in the afternoon the ability he had been showing his connections in the morning. And while he is far from a finished product, Vino Rosso earned his spot in the Kentucky Derby with a three-length victory over Enticed in the Grade 2, \$1 million Wood Memorial at Aqueduct on April 7.

The victory was not without controversy. Vino Rosso, ridden by John Velazquez, and Enticed bumped twice in the stretch, prompting a steward’s inquiry and an objection from Junior Alvarado, the rider of Enticed.

The stewards dismissed the foul claim, saying they did not believe the contact impacted the outcome of the race.

Enticed, who had already clinched his spot in the Derby with a victory in last month’s Grade 3 Gotham, finished second by 2 1/4 lengths over Restoring Hope. It was six lengths back to Firenze Fire in fourth.

The victory was worth 100 qualifying points to Vino Rosso, giving him 107 and putting him into the Derby field. Vino Rosso gave trainer Todd Pletcher his fifth victory in the Wood Memorial and adds to his already strong Kentucky Derby arsenal that includes Florida Derby winner Audible, Louisiana Derby winner Noble Indy, and Rebel Stakes winner Magnum Moon.

“We got a lot of nice horses that are consistent and show up every time and have the pedigree to suggest they’ll handle the distance,” said Pletcher, who won last year’s Kentucky Derby with Always Dreaming. “At the same time, this looks like a really deep and tough crop. We’ll keep our fingers crossed and hope they all stay healthy.”

Vino Rosso, a son of Curlin owned by Vinnie Viola and Mike Repole, was coming off a fourth-place finish in the Tampa Bay Derby and a third in the Sam F. Davis at Tampa Bay Downs. In both races, Vino Rosso appeared to struggle around the second turn.

Pletcher said after watching him train recently, he deduced that Vino Rosso just didn’t handle the Tampa surface.

The Wood was run oddly. Old Time Revival ran off under Jeremy Rose and opened up a six-length lead on the field after running a half-mile in 46.68 seconds. Enticed was in second position, with Restoring Hope to his outside in third.

Vino Rosso, seventh early, moved into fifth down the backside and was fourth entering the far turn.

The trio of Enticed, Restoring Hope, and Vino Rosso had caught up to Old Time Revival by the five-sixteenths pole. Turning into the stretch, it was clear the race was coming down to Vino Rosso, on the outside, and Enticed on the inside.

In upper stretch, Vino Rosso appeared to come over on Enticed, who had tried to keep Vino Rosso parked out turning for home. The two bumped twice, with Vino Rosso’s back end turned toward the outside. Velazquez slapped Vino Rosso and he began to edge away from Enticed.

Velazquez called the contact “mutual.”

“He’s coming out and if you watch the turn I’m going to hold him in,” Velazquez said. “My horse switches leads and I touch him a little bit and I’m a half a length in front of him. Now he [Enticed] turns my horse in, and I pull him out and he turns him in again. He hit him left-handed trying to push me out.”

Alvarado was incensed there was no change.

“I got bumped three times and got pinched on the rail ... this was way too much,” Alvarado said. “I didn’t bump him once.”

Kiaran McLaughlin, the trainer of Enticed, felt his horse should have been elevated to first.

“They’ve taken them down a lot more often with less,” McLaughlin said.

Said Pletcher: “No question there was contact. I think it was mutual and I don’t think it affected the outcome of the race. I think Vino Rosso looked like he was going to win it at that point and Enticed was going to finish second.”

Vino Rosso covered the 1 1/8 miles in 1:49.79 and returned \$10.40 to win as the third choice.

Velazquez, who rides three of Pletcher’s four Derby qualifiers, will have a decision to make in the coming weeks. He does believe Vino Rosso still has more to learn.

“I thought he ran well and he still needs to put it together,” Velazquez said.

Enticed is also expected to move on to the Kentucky Derby. Restoring Hope, who

finished third in his stakes debut, earned 20 points, but that most likely will not be enough to crack the Derby field.

Firenze Fire picked up 10 points and now has 39. His owner, Ron Lombardi, said "most likely" Firenze Fire will be pointed to the Derby.

Good Magic returned to the form that made him a champion when edging away to a 1 1/2-length victory as the favorite in the 94th running of the Grade 2, \$1 million Blue Grass Stakes at Keeneland on April 7.

Ridden by Jose Ortiz, Good Magic will head to the Kentucky Derby as one of the favorites after rebounding from a third-place finish in the March 3 Fountain of Youth in his only prior start as a 3-year-old. His victory in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile last November earned the colt the Eclipse Award for top 2-year-old of 2017.

"I loved the way he did it today," said Chad Brown, who trains Good Magic for the partnership of eFive Racing Thoroughbreds and Stonestreet Stables.

Showing his handiness when fifth of 14 3-year-olds through the opening stages, Good Magic began moving up approaching the half-mile pole, finally drawing even with front-running Flameaway as they neared the quarter pole. Down the stretch, with Ortiz keeping him to a steady drive, Good Magic gradually increased his advantage as Flameaway persisted to hold second.

Sporting Chance finished third, another 1 3/4 lengths back, but the D. Wayne Lukas-trained colt was disqualified to fourth for swerving out sharply with about 100 yards to go, impeding Free Drop Billy, who was elevated from fourth to third on the stewards' decision.

Good Magic, a Curlin colt bred by Stonestreet, returned \$5.20 to win after finishing in 1:50.18 over a fast track. He now won 2 of 5 starts, with his BC victory having come as a maiden. He earned 100 qualifying points toward the Derby.

Under a late-developing sun on a day when early snow and unseasonable cold limited the ontrack crowd to just 14,629,

Flameaway was sent to the early lead by Jose Lezcano with Arawak hounding him to the outside. They sped a few lengths clear down the backside, with Sporting Chance and Kanthaka following closest and Good Magic in a good spot behind them.

"It was perfect," Ortiz said. "I was pretty confident on him. I was hoping he would put me in good position and he did."

Brown said Good Magic will remain stabled among his 25-horse string at Keeneland for the foreseeable future before moving over to Churchill Downs, where the 144th Derby will be run May 5.

"We'll go over to Churchill, we'll figure out when," said Brown. "We'll give him at least one work over the track there. We'll maybe get his first work out of the way back here. Hopefully he'll be able to handle the mile and a quarter."

Brown said Good Magic "probably was a little short, in hindsight," for the Fountain of Youth at Gulfstream Park. "He was a stronger, fitter horse for this. I thought it was an outstanding performance. This win means a lot. I'm so grateful to win this race."

Flameaway, the 5-1 second choice in the Blue Grass, continued to show his hallmark of consistency and also will proceed to the Derby, said trainer Mark Casse. Trainer Dale Romans also said he most likely will run Free Drop Billy, assuming the colt makes the 20-horse cutoff governed by the qualifying points.

The connections of My Miss Lilly didn't feel that their filly had a clean trip when she finished third in the Busher Stakes in March and believed she was deserving of another chance to show that she could be a Kentucky Oaks candidate.

On April 7 at Aqueduct, My Miss Lilly took advantage of that second chance, getting a clear, albeit wide, trip under Joe Bravo and outfinishing a stubborn Sara Street to win the Grade 2, \$300,000 Gazelle Stakes by a half-length. It was a neck farther back to Virginia Key in third.

Midnight Disguise, the Busher winner and 8-5 Gazelle favorite, finished a well-beaten fourth and was promptly removed from Kentucky Oaks consideration by her connections. Mo Shopping and Smokinpad-

dylasie completed the order of finish.

My Miss Lilly's victory for owners Don and Donna Adam and trainer Mark Hennig helped make up for disappointing performances a week ago at Gulfstream Park turned in by Strike Power (Florida Derby) and Cache (Gulfstream Oaks).

"I'm in a little bit better mood this week," a smiling Hennig said in the winner's circle.

In the Busher, My Miss Lilly seemed to encounter traffic at every turn under Manny Franco. With that in mind, Hennig asked Bravo to keep My Miss Lilly in the clear if possible.

Bravo had My Miss Lilly in fourth early, three to four wide and within 3 1/2 lengths of the modest pace set by Sara Street and pressed by Mo Shopping. The opening half-mile went in 48.32 seconds.

Leaving the half-mile pole, Bravo had My Miss Lilly four wide and on the move, and approaching the quarter pole, she was on even terms with Sara Street and Virginia Key as Mo Shopping retreated.

The trio ran in a line from the quarter pole to inside the sixteenth pole before My Miss Lilly edged away. My Miss Lilly, a daughter of Tapit, covered the 1 1/8 miles in 1:50.42 as the 5-2 second choice.

"Today, I thought it was important to keep her out in the clear, and that's what I told Joe: 'I don't want a repeat of what happened last time,'" Hennig said. "She had to go a little wide coming off the turn. I was worried that might catch up to her late. I feel like she's going to relish more and more distance. Like Joe said, it felt like she could have run around there again. She was very strong."

My Miss Lilly earned 100 qualifying points toward the May 4 Kentucky Oaks, and Hennig said she most likely would head that way.

Getting a clean stalking trip under Javier Castellano, Rushing Fall surged to the lead after turning for home in the one-mile race, then turned back a challenge from Daddy Is a Legend before finishing a length clear of late-running Thewayiam. Goodthingstaketime was up in the final jumps for third over Daddy Is a Legend, whose efforts were badly compromised by a poor start.

Rushing Fall, a Kentucky-bred daughter of More Than Ready, finished in 1:38.66 over a yielding course.

Chad Brown, who trains Rushing Fall for the eFive Racing Thoroughbreds of the Edwards family, said he will take time to consider the next option for Rushing Fall, who now is 4 for 4 after capping a perfect 2017 with a victory in the Nov. 3 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf.

Longshots took the early lead in the race while Castellano got 1-2 favorite Rushing Fall to settle perfectly in fourth, several lengths behind them.

"She really was very comfortable," Castellano said. "I put her in a good spot and she took it from there. She's one of the best fillies I've ever ridden in my career, or she is before long."

Thewayiam, the 4-1 second choice under Jose Ortiz, ran very well, incurring her first defeat in her last four starts. The Graham Motion-trained filly had reeled off wins in three straight stakes at the Gulfstream Park meet.

Bound for Nowhere kept everyone waiting, except when the race was run. The colt's stubborn behavior helped delay the Shakertown Stakes by some six minutes but certainly did not manifest itself once the gates were sprung, as he sped off to a four-length triumph in the 5 1/2-furlong turf race under Julio Garcia.

Owned and trained by Wesley Ward, Bound for Nowhere was victorious in a stakes for the first time, although the 4-year-old colt had only had two prior opportunities, both in rugged Group 1 events last summer in France.

Regrouped over the winter at Keeneland and Turfway Park, with one easy Turfway allowance win as his lone prep race, the son of The Factor ran a real corker in the 22nd edition of the Grade 2, \$200,000 Shakertown on April 7, giving closest chase to the longshot front-runner, Latent Revenge, before drawing off unchallenged down the stretch.

"He's usually more well behaved than that," said Ward, referring to the colt's refusal to load for several minutes. "I'm just glad he ran the way we knew he can. We kept him here all winter, and it paid off. This is the greatest place in the world."

Bucchero, the winner of the Grade 2 Woodford here last fall, rallied to be second, 2 1/4 lengths before Disco Partner, the 7-5 favorite in a field of 12 older horses.

Bound for Nowhere returned \$19 to win after finishing 5 1/2 furlongs in 1:03.77 over a course rated soft. Ward said he likely will point the colt to the Royal Ascot meet in England in June.

Beau Recall closed from last in the field of nine to win her first graded stakes in the Grade 2, \$201,380 Royal Heroine Stakes for fillies and mares on turf at Santa Anita on April 7.

The milestone victory was the first time jockey Joel Rosario had been aboard the 4-year-old Irish-bred filly who races for Slam Dunk Racing and Medallion Racing and trainer Simon Callaghan.

Rosario heard simple prerace instructions from Callaghan.

“He told me to make one run,” Rosario said.

Beau Recall (\$10.80) closed with a rush on the outside to take the lead in the final sixteenth and finish three-quarters of a length in front of an unlucky Thundering Sky, a 4-1 shot who raced in traffic on the turn and in early stretch and still closed well late.

Beau Recall, the third betting choice, ran one mile on turf in 1:34.52. She was seventh with a furlong to go, trailing stretch leader Madame Stripes by about 2 1/2 lengths.

“I fell back a bit, but she was happy with where she was,” Rosario said. “I was waiting until she wanted to do it. At the three-eighths pole, I woke her up a little bit.”

Madame Stripes (9-2) finished third after racing as a stalker for the first half-mile behind pacesetters Mongolian Shopper and Enola Gray. Madame Stripes led in the stretch and was beaten 1 1/4 lengths.

Enola Gray, the 2-1 favorite, faded to finish fourth.

Beau Recall, by Sir Prancealot, has won 3 of 12 starts and earned \$356,877. A maiden winner in Ireland in 2016, Beau Recall ran in eight consecutive stakes in 2017 and earlier this year. During that span, her best results were a second in the Grade 2 Honeymoon Stakes here last June and a second, by a nose, in the Grade 1 Del Mar Oaks last August.

In her only other start this year, Beau Recall was fourth as the 2-1 favorite in the Grade 3 Las Cienegas Stakes at about 6 1/2 furlongs on the hillside turf course on Jan. 20, the shortest race of her career.

National Flag had an ugly start in the Grade 3 Bay Shore at Aqueduct on April 7 but saved the day with a fast finish to pull away and win by four lengths.

At the start of the seven-furlong race for 3-year-olds, Justaholic bobbled and came outward and Engage came inward sandwiching National Flag between them. Jockey Flavien Prat stayed cool aboard National Flag and didn't rush him as he dropped well back in the seven-horse field.

The Bay Shore pace was set by A Different Style, with Aveenu Malcainu and 24-1 Aqua Bel Sar in close attendance. Aveenu Malcainu moved up outside A Different Style nearing the stretch. At that point, National Flag still had a lot of work to do.

Aveenu Malcainu came away with the lead in upper stretch but at that point National Flag was eating up ground with long strides while far out in the track. He collared Aveenu Malcainu nearing the sixteenth pole and quickly pulled away.

Engage, the 6-5 favorite, recovered quicker from the rough start than National Flag, and took up a contending position along the inside. He finished willingly to best Aveenu Malcainu for the place from the inside in deep stretch.

National Flag paid \$4.90 in the \$250,000 Bay Shore. He was timed in 1:23.16 while making up several lengths through a 12.38-second final furlong.

National Flag, a \$600,000 Keeneland September yearling buy, races for WinStar Farm, China Horse Club International, and SF Racing.

"I was concerned early in the race," Pletcher said. "He'd never really been in that position and you never know how a horse is going to react to getting bumped that hard at the beginning. But it looked like he gathered himself up and Flavien rode a smart race. He didn't panic and gave him time to get his legs up underneath him. He produced a big run down the lane."

Pletcher said at some point he would stretch National Flag out in distance.

"We had kicked around the idea of possibly going to the Lexington," Pletcher said. "But we just kind of thought at the last minute that the horse was doing well and was just coming off a big effort at seven furlongs. So, let's stick with what he knows."

Both horse and owners took Keeneland by storm on April 7 when Warrior's Club, owned by the exuberant members of the Churchill Downs Racing Club, scored the first graded victory of his career with an upset in the Grade 3, \$250,000 Commonwealth at Keeneland.

The triumph set off a jubilant celebration from the group's many owners, all of whom own a small percentage of the horse, as they marched their way to the post-race trophy presentation. Bettors who supported the winner also had a right to be jubilant, with the colt going off at 23-1 odds following a sixth-place finish in the Feb. 8 Hot Spring Stakes at Oaklawn in his last start.

Warrior's Club was rated in third by Luis Contreras, stalking pacesetter Westwood as that one set splits of 22.40 seconds and 45.15 in the seven-furlong Commonwealth. Warrior's Club then outfinished a couple of stretch-charging rivals.

He hit the wire a neck in front of 8-5 favorite Limousine Liberal, with 16-1 Awesome Saturday another neck behind in third.

"The name describes him about as well as anything," winning trainer D. Wayne Lukas said. "He's a warrior."

A 4-year-old son of Warrior's Reward, he raced seven furlongs in 1:22.61 over a fast Keeneland track that was upgraded a couple times over the course of the chilly afternoon. He notched his second stakes victory in winning the Commonwealth after taking the restricted Spendthrift Stallion Stakes at Churchill Downs as a 2-year-old in 2016. He paid \$48.80.

Lukas credited the horse following the race, saying he is regularly eager to train and race. "A used-car salesman could train him," he quipped.

Limousine Liberal, making his first start of the year, ran in spurts in defeat. He advanced into contention from midpack on

the backstretch and turn, then seemed to idle off horses in early stretch before finding his stride again in the closing sixteenth. He outgamed Awesome for the place and surpassed the \$1 million earnings mark with his runner-up finish.

The seasons may change, but trainer Linda Rice's stranglehold on Aqueduct stakes for fillies and mares hasn't.

On April 6, opening day of the Aqueduct spring meet – a day that began with a winter feel but gradually improved weather-wise – Holiday Disguise ran by her stablemate Sounds Delicious to win the Grade 3, \$150,000 Distaff Handicap by a length. Though Sounds Delicious held second by a head over Divine Miss Grey, she was disqualified by the stewards and placed fourth for interfering with fourth-place finisher Torrent in deep stretch. Divine Miss Grey was elevated to second, Torrent to third.

Holiday Disguise gave Rice her eighth stakes victory with a filly or mare this year at Aqueduct. Holiday Disguise won the Biogio's Rose in February.

Holiday Disguise finished second to Divine Miss Grey in the Heavenly Prize here on March 10. That day, Divine Miss Grey got loose on the lead and Holiday Disguise simply chased her home.

This time, Sounds Delicious proved faster than Divine Miss Grey and set fractions of 22.41 seconds for the opening quarter and 44.99 for the half-mile, chased by Divine Miss Grey.

Meanwhile, Irad Ortiz Jr. had Holiday Disguise in fourth, but within three lengths of the lead down the backstretch.

Midway around the far turn, Divine Miss Grey went after Sounds Delicious, but Sounds Delicious kept her at bay.

In the stretch, Sounds Delicious, under Junior Alvarado, was in the two path, leaving room along the rail for Torrent, ridden

by Jose Lezcano. Divine Miss Grey, under Kendrick Carmouche, was fighting on as Holiday Disguise had a clear path while widest of all.

Inside the sixteenth pole, Sounds Delicious and Torrent bumped, while Holiday Disguise passed them both about 50 yards from the wire.

The stewards deemed that Sounds Delicious was at fault in the incident with Torrent. Steve Lewandowski, the New York State Gaming Commission steward, said that because the disqualified horse and the winning horse had the same trainer, the stewards had the option of disqualifying Holiday Disguise from first. But, Lewandowski said the stewards didn't feel that Holiday Disguise received an unfair advantage from the bumping incident.

"We had the right to consider it, but we treated [the winner] as an individual," Lewandowski said.

Holiday Disguise, a 4-year-old New York-bred daughter of Harlan's Holiday owned by Sheila Rosenblum, covered the seven furlongs in 1:22.98 and returned \$10.20 as the third choice.

Discreet Lover's victory in the Grade 3 Excelsior on April 7 was meaningful on many levels for trainer Uriah St. Lewis.

The Excelsior was the first graded victory for 5-year-old Discreet Lover, who is now 6 for 37. The race also was the first graded score for St. Lewis, who has been based at Parx Racing since 1989.

After the Excelsior, St. Lewis dedicated the win to the late jockey Jose Luis Flores, who rode Discreet Lover in 21 races.

"Jose used to ride this horse all the time. He rode most of my horses," St. Lewis said. "I love Jose Flores. This win is for Jose."

Flores rode Discreet Lover to a third-place finish in the Harrison Johnson Memorial at Laurel Park on March 17. Two days later he went down in a spill at Parx that cost him his life.

St. Lewis is a 60-year-old native of Trinidad and Tobago, a dual-island nation near Venezuela. He bought Discreet Lover for \$10,000 as a 2-year-old at a Fasig-Tipton sale

at Timonium.

Discreet Lover has won three of his last six starts.

"He tries all the time," Lewis said. "He eats good and doesn't care whom he runs against."

Discreet Lover stumbled at the start of the 1 1/8-mile Excelsior and grabbed a quarter. He lagged back in last early as jockey Manny Franco bided his time.

On the front end, Zanotti set the pace on short lead while being dogged by Control Group and Harlan Punch. The trio set even fractions of 24.81, 48.72, and 1:12.70.

The leaders continued to battle in the stretch, but Franco sent Discreet Lover wide and in midstretch it was clear he was moving best. He hit the finish 2 1/2 lengths the best.

Discreet Lover paid \$17.60 to win in the seven-horse field. He was timed in 1:50.45.

"He stumbled out of the gate and after that I didn't want to use him too much," Franco said. "I just sat and waited as long as I could because I didn't want to move early, either. He finished very well."

Zanotti held second by a neck over Harlan Punch. Backsideofthemoon finished fourth, two lengths farther back. Control Group was fifth, a neck behind Backsideofthemoon.

Harlan Punch broke slowly and then pulled his way to contention from between horses on the first turn.

It turns out Gas Station Sushi kept well and traveled well. The filly, sent away as the favorite in her first start since an eye-catching debut last August in California, rallied to win the Grade 3, \$150,000 Beaumont Stakes by 1 1/2 lengths at Keeneland on April 8.

Gas Station Sushi was a 3 1/2-length winner of her career debut Aug. 6 at Del Mar, earning a Beyer Speed Figure of 85, which, to that point, was one of the top

figures of the year for a 2-year-old filly and finished the year in the top 20 for that division. She was expected to be one of the top choices in the Grade 1 Del Mar Debutante but was forced to scratch after running a high temperature the week of the race, and wound up not starting the rest of her juvenile season.

Gas Station Sushi has been in a steady training pattern preparing for her comeback, under the tutelage of regular exercise rider Anna Meah. Corey Nakatani, who has ridden her in both her starts, climbs aboard for works.

"She's a very easy horse to train, she takes it easy on herself," said David Meah, assistant to trainer Richard Baltas. "She does everything very easily. [We've been] staying out of her way, letting her get her fitness work by work. Corey's been aboard her every work, and we really appreciate that, because he's gotten to know her really well, and she's gotten to know him really well. It's just a great combination."

Gas Station Sushi had shipped-in in time to have her most recent breeze, April 3, at Keeneland to get acclimated to the track.

"I think [having a work at Keeneland] was key," Meah said. "It helped that she got a good feel of it and she (was) quite confident having a go over it."

Bothered slightly at the start, Gas Station Sushi (\$6.20) was sixth leaving the backstretch as Uppercut led the field through an opening half of 45.41 seconds. With Nakatani looking for room, the filly fanned out into the five path to make her run, and rallied to drive clear in the final stages, hitting the wire 1 1/2 lengths in front. The final time for the seven furlongs was 1:26.77.

"[Sitting off the pace] wasn't the plan," Nakatani said of his filly, who pressed the pace in her only other start. "She didn't get away great. I was trying to sit in and be patient with her. I have such high [regard for] her."

Kelly's Humor, who was last early, rallied to edge Uppercut by three-quarters of a length for second, with Happy Like a Fool another neck back in fourth.

The Beaumont awarded Gas Station Sushi, a daughter of Into Mischief, 10 points toward a berth in the Kentucky Oaks, but is, realistically, unlikely to affect the field for the filly classic, as the cutoff to make the 14-horse field looks to be hovering around 20 points. She may be targeted for the Grade 2 Eight Belles on the Oaks undercard.

Wowing the 18,374 on hand for the opener of the 16-day Keeneland spring meet on April 6, Analyze It sped off to a 5 1/4-length victory in the feature race, the Grade 3 Transylvania Stakes, stamping himself as the apparent pro tem leader among 3-year-old turf horses in North America. Captivating Moon was up for second in the field of 11, a nose ahead of Admiralty Pier.

"When I asked him to go, he went so well, so smooth," said Jose Ortiz, who was aboard Analyze It for owner William H. Lawrence and trainer Chad Brown. "He's a really, really nice horse."

Analyze It returned \$3.60 as the heavy favorite after finishing 1 1/16 miles in 1:45.60 over a turf course rated yielding.

Reserved in third early, well off a fast pace set by 117-1 shot Beer Pressure and always in a good spot, Analyze It moved to the lead without urging leaving the quarter-pole. He quickly separated himself from the pack before being given one smack by Ortiz to his right flank and another on his right shoulder to keep his momentum going. The impressive score kept the bay colt unbeaten in three starts and confirmed the form he put on display last year in winning a maiden race at Belmont Park in late October and the Grade 3 Cecil B. DeMille at Del Mar in late November.

"All options are on the table with him, but it'd be hard for me to keep my eye off the Belmont Derby," said Brown, referring to the Grade 1, \$1.2 million turf race on July 7 at Belmont Park.

Analyze It, from the first crop of the young sire Point of Entry, made the lead in his first two wins, but he settled perfectly in the early going for Ortiz behind a run-off leader in the Transylvania.

"He broke well, and I made him relax into the first turn," said Ortiz. "He relaxed very well for me."

Behind the top three, Dragon Drew was fourth, another half-length behind Admiralty Pier, while Maraud, the 5-2 second choice, had no apparent mishap when finishing fifth.

Patience, both by trainer Leonard Powell and jockey Joel Rosario, paid off for the filly Fatale Bere on April 7 at Santa Anita in the Grade 3, \$151,035 Providencia Stakes, as she turned in an auspicious performance in her delayed 3-year-old debut when unleashing a strong closing kick to capture the first of the four graded stakes races on the card.

Fatale Bere (\$17.80) had not raced since November, and Powell initially wanted to run her earlier this meet.

“But she was a little slower coming around than we expected,” Powell said. “There’s a good program for 3-year-old fillies on the turf, so we thought why rush to make an earlier race and mess up the rest of the year.”

Similar discipline was exercised in the race by Rosario, who kept Fatale Bere a safe, stalking distance behind the leaders, then turned her loose in the final quarter-mile. She went on to win by 1 1/2 lengths over pace-setting Ms Bad Behavior, who was 2 1/4 lengths in front of third-place Paved, the 7-5 favorite.

Fatale Bere completed 1 1/8 miles on firm turf in 1:47.48 and flew the final three furlongs in less than 35 seconds.

Paved, favored to win her third straight, was right outside of Ms Bad Behavior the whole way but failed to kick on.

“I would have liked to have gotten her cover,” said her jockey, Drayden Van Dyke. “We were in chase mode, and she was relaxed, but I’d like to see her further back. I think she can do better with different tactics.”

Fatale Bere raced three times in her native France before being privately purchased to race in this country. She won the Surfer Girl at Santa Anita in October, was a close fifth in the Breeders’ Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf, then was freshened after finishing eighth in the Grade 3 Jimmy Durante at Del Mar on Nov. 25.

Powell said Fatale Bere would remain in California for the immediate future, and said his main goal in upcoming months is the Grade 1 Belmont Oaks at Belmont Park on July 7.

Fatale Bere, a daughter of Pedro the Great, has won 4 times in 7 starts. Powell and his wife, Mathilde, own her along with a partnership that includes the Benewitz Family Trust, Head of Plains Partners, and Mark Mathiesen.

Prat did not urge Hoppertunity in the final furlong.

"I was trying to stay in the clear on the backstretch," Prat said. "He grabbed the

bit and showed me he wanted to go."

Twentytwentyvision, claimed for \$62,500 last November, closed from last in the field of six to finish second, 5 1/4 lengths clear of 38-1 Moonman. Noble Nick and Beaumarchais completed the order of finish. Infobedad, who was near the front early, was pulled up on the turn and walked off the track.

Hoppertunity was timed in 2:32.63. The \$100,345 Tokyo City Cup on dirt was Hoppertunity's first start of the year. He was fourth in the Grade 2 San Antonio Stakes at 1 1/8 miles on Dec. 26, the opening day of the track's winter-spring meeting.

"We thought the mile and a half would be easy on him," trainer Bob Baffert said.

A 7-year-old horse by Any Given Saturday, Hoppertunity was entered for the Grade 1 Santa Anita Handicap on March 10 but did not start after rain left the track wet-fast. Hoppertunity races for Mike Pegram, Karl Watson, and Paul Weitman and has won 8 of 30 starts and earned \$4,407,025.
