Justify, by deceased Scat Daddy, wins the Kentucky Derby to remain undefeated in four starts and become the fifth Derby winner for his trainer, Bob Baffert.

The eagle has landed.

The moon shot of trying to win the Kentucky Derby with a horse who never raced at 2, which hadn't been done since Apollo in 1882, finally ended on May 5 on a rainy, dreary day at Churchill Downs that was in contrast to the ray of sunshine on the racetrack.

Justify, in a brilliant performance for any horse, let alone a 3-year-old colt who had a mere three starts to his name, set a wicked pace, disposed of an early pace challenger, then more serious bids from Bolt d'Oro and then the champion colt Good Magic, and prevailed in the 144th Derby, giving trainer Bob Baffert his fifth Derby, second best all-time.

"He ranks right up there with my top ones," said Baffert, who in a recent interview repeatedly referred to Justify as a "superior racehorse," words he uttered for his top-class colts **American Pharoah**, the 2015 Triple Crown winner, and Arrogate far deeper into their careers. "It took a great horse to do what he did today."

What Justify did was fly out of the gate under jockey Mike Smith and take up residence just outside Promises Fulfilled through a torrid opening quarter in 22.24 seconds and opening half in 45.77 seconds. The pace was enervating for Promises

Fulfilled, who began to weaken nearing the far turn, after six furlongs in 1:11.01, and – underscoring how well Justify ran – faded to 15th.

Bolt d'Oro, who had been sitting just behind the top two, made a mild run at Justify going around the far turn, but he too couldn't keep up with the demanding pace and dropped away before the quarter pole. Next came Good Magic, who ranged up outside Justify at the top of the stretch and loomed a threat, but he too could not get to Justify, and by the furlong pole, Justify had a 2 1/2-length lead that he maintained all the way to the wire.

Good Magic held on for second, a head in front of Audible, who encountered traffic trouble down the backstretch and more so just before the quarter pole before rallying up the rail for third.

The early pace and a track rendered sloppy by day-long rain resulted in a race that was fast early, slow late, with Justify completing 1 1/4 miles in 2:04.20. He was

given a Beyer Speed Figure of 103.

The victory was significant on many levels.

Justify (\$7.80) became the sixth straight favorite to win the Derby since Churchill Downs switched to a points system to determine the starting field. He also became the ninth horse to win the Derby while still unbeaten.

Baffert, with his fifth win, now trails only the late Ben Jones, who won the Derby six times, among trainers.

For Smith, it was his second Derby victory, having won previously with the longshot Giacomo in 2005. Smith, 52, also became the second-oldest jockey to win the Derby, behind Bill Shoemaker, who was 54 when he won in 1986.

Justify is owned by a partnership, that includes Sol Kumin, who is a co-owner of Monomoy Girl, the winner of the Kentucky Oaks. Kumin became the first owner to win the Derby and Oaks in the same year since 1952.

Another co-owner, the WinStar Farm of Kenny Troutt, was winning the Derby for the second time, following [Super Saver](#) in 2010.

And a third co-owner, Starlight Racing, is managed by Jack Wolf, a resident of Louisville who became the first local since 1914 to own a Derby winner.

Derby Day dawned cloudy, but then a record-setting rain moved in and wouldn't leave, like a bad houseguest. More than 2 1/2 inches fell from midnight until post time for the Derby, eclipsing the previous Derby Day record of 2.31 inches set exactly 100 years ago. The day-long rain forced many of the crowd of 157,813 – the eighth-largest in Derby history – to take shelter inside. The rain, which resulted in flash-flood warnings in the area, also turned the track to slop, marking the fifth time in the last 10 years that the Derby was run on an off track.

But neither the crowded stands, crowded paddock, nor crowded 20-horse starting

gate rattled Justify. Showing maturity beyond his three races, he saddled without incident and was well-behaved in the post parade.

A major key to Justify's success, Baffert and Smith knew, was in the start, and Smith was aggressive leaving the gate from post 7, allowing him to take up an ideal position just outside of Promises Fulfilled. There was much trouble farther out leaving the gate, where Magnum Moon, from post 16, veered in sharply, bothering Instilled Regard and, far more significantly, Mendelssohn, who was clobbered a few strides out of the gate and found himself in an untenable position from which he never recovered.

"When he got away clean, I thought he had a chance," Baffert said. But as the fractions unfolded on the television on which Baffert watched the race, "I thought he was going to lay down."

After turning away several challengers, though, the last being Good Magic, it was obvious Justify was home.

"The last eighth, when I knew he was going to win, I was in awe," Baffert said. "That's the best Kentucky Derby-winning performance of a horse I've had."

Justify, by the late sire Scat Daddy, was purchased as yearling for \$500,000 by Elliott Walden, the chief executive of WinStar. Over time, the partnership grew to include Kumin's Head of Plains Partners, Starlight Racing, and the China Horse Club headed by Teo Ah Khing.

Walden manages the horse for the partnership and decided to send the colt to Baffert.

"We knew we had something really special," Baffert said after the race. "But he had to prove it today."

"It's like having LeBron," he said, referring to basketball star LeBron James. "You better win a championship."

Baffert first realized he had something special in Justify when he arrived at his barn at Santa Anita and had his first workout. A few weeks later, on the morning of his first start, Feb. 18, Baffert said, "I've got big plans for that colt this afternoon."

Justify won that day, next took an allowance race, then captured the Santa Anita Derby. In the space of just 48 days, he went from an unstarted maiden to the winner of the West's major prep for the Kentucky Derby.

And then four weeks later, not even three months after his first race, the moon shot Baffert mapped out with Justify touched down perfectly in the winner's circle at Churchill Downs. After all the nervous-

ness and fretting, the Apollo mission was complete. Justify was at Tranquility Base.

Before May 5, Monomoy Girl had not faced a more prolonged nor important duel. So when Wonder Gadot moved boldly to engage her for the stretch run of the 144th running of the Grade 1, \$1 million Kentucky Oaks at Churchill Downs, the moment of truth had arrived.

"She's a great filly, and she showed it today," said Brad Cox, the trainer of Monomoy Girl. "It's just a tremendous victory for everybody involved with this filly."

Always among the front flight in the 1 1/8-mile Oaks after breaking cleanly from the outside post in a full field of 14 3-year-old fillies, Monomoy Girl emerged the winner by a half-length following a dramatic battle inside of Wonder Gadot, giving Cox, a Louisville native, the greatest triumph of his career.

Florent Geroux was aboard Monomoy Girl, who finished in 1:49.13 over a fast track and returned \$7.20 as the second choice. Midnight Bisou, the 2-1 favorite, was another 3 3/4 lengths back in third, with Eskimo Kisses another half-length back in fourth.

Take Charge Paula sped to the early lead in the race, with Geroux subtly moving over from the outer post to assume a favorable stalking position aboard Monomoy Girl. Suddenly, by the three-eighths pole, and without urging, Monomoy Girl had opened a clear advantage over her Cox stablemate, Sassy Sienna, but then an outside rush from Wonder Gadot made it a two-horse race as they left the quarter pole. Geroux put his mount to a fierce hand ride while delivering her several sharp strokes of a left-handed whip, giving the French native his first win in the filly classic.

"The filly was sharp early and I just hustled her out of the gate to get a good position," said Geroux. "From there, I was pretty confident. You can get after her too much and she stops. I kept hand-riding her and she pulled away at the end."

Velazquez, the jockey of 16-1 shot Wonder Gadot, claimed foul, saying Monomoy Girl interfered with his mount by knocking her off balance when they made light contact. But the stewards ruled no change in the order after reviewing the replay for several minutes.

Monomoy Girl, from the first crop of the young sire Tapizar, has won 6 of 7 career starts, with her lone defeat coming here last fall in the Golden Rod Stakes to Road to Victory.

Monomoy Girl was originally owned by the Monomoy Stables of Sol Kumin before three other entities – Michael Dubb, The Elkstone Group, and Bethlehem Stables – bought into her. After starting her career by winning two races on turf in September, she won an ungraded stakes on the Churchill dirt prior to Road to Victory slipping past her for a neck upset in the Golden Rod. Given a little time, Monomoy Girl emerged as a top Oaks contender upon her return by winning the Grade 2 Rachel Alexandra at Fair Grounds and the Grade 1 Ashland at Keeneland, flaunting a brilliant turn of foot that once again showed itself in the most important race of her career.

Midnight Bisou, well back most of the way after somewhat of a troubled start under Mike Smith, was never a real threat to the top pair.

“I don’t know if the bad start cost me the race, but it cost me enough,” said Smith.

Cox, who was down to just a two-horse stable when losing a major client nearly six years ago, has been the leading trainer at a number of major race meets in the Midwest over the last couple of years, including the September and fall meets at Churchill in 2017. The first Grade 1 victory of his career came with Monomoy Girl in the Ashland.

Monomoy Girl, a chestnut Kentucky-bred, was produced by the Henny Hughes mare Drummette. She earned \$564,200, bringing her career bankroll to \$1,120,750. Cox said he will consider all options, including the major New York races starting with the June 9 Acorn, with the ultimate goal being a return to Churchill for the Nov. 2 Breeders’ Cup Distaff.

Yoshida was bred, born, and raised in Japan, and after winning his first Grade 1 in Kentucky, capturing the \$500,000 Turf Classic by three-quarters of a length over Beach Patrol on May 5, he could be headed to England.

The partnership that owns Yoshida – the China Horse Club, WinStar Farm, and Head of Plains Partners – is keen to race Yoshida in the Group 1 Queen Anne Stakes, the traditional first race of the Royal Ascot meet, and Yoshida did nothing in the Turf Classic to dissuade his connections from taking that trip.

Whipping up alongside Beach Patrol midway around the far turn, Yoshida (\$21.60) and jockey Jose Ortiz got nearly a length in front of Beach Patrol turning for home and then held clear a typically gritty response from the Turf Classic favorite.

Yoshida, trained by Bill Mott, was a very talented 3-year-old of 2017, capping his campaign with a win Oct. 7 in the Grade 3 Hill Prince Stakes. This was the first start of his 4-year-old season, and Yoshida appears to have improved with age and maturity.

“He had a layup and the winter off, and he’s come back strong,” Mott said. “We thought he was fit enough and the right quality to go into the Grade 1.”

Yoshida had turned in a dazzling performance in winning the \$100,000 James W. Murphy Stakes last spring over a wet Pimlico course, and neither Mott nor Ortiz had concerns about the Churchill Downs turf turned yielding by persistent, Derby-Day-record rain.

As Shining Copper was sent out to lead, tracked by Beach Patrol, who got over from an outside draw, Yoshida took up a midpack position, just where Ortiz wanted to be. Ortiz said his horse bobbed a couple times around the first turn but generally traveled smoothly as Shining Copper set splits of 24.86 and 50.61 seconds.

Racing outside and up to third position at the half-mile pole, Yoshida waited for Ortiz’s cue, and did not have to wait long.

“I know I got a nice horse underneath me, so at the three-furlong, I went after [Beach Patrol],” Ortiz said. “It was easy fractions early, so I went after him and made it a two-horse race.”

As Yoshida made his move, Joel Rosario on Beach Patrol was forced to go, too, but by the time Beach Patrol got fully engaged, Yoshida already had the jump. Beach Patrol, likened to a pit bull by trainer Chad Brown earlier this week, dug in for a fight but never could get back on terms.

“I had a perfect trip,” Rosario said, “and

he gave me everything he has. He tried hard. I tried to move on with [Yoshida], but he had too much horse. He was fighting hard; he just doesn't want to get beat."

Beach Patrol, the 8-5 favorite, comfortably beat everyone else in the race, finishing three lengths in front of Synchrony, who was last down the backside and tried to make a run in upper stretch but couldn't sustain it over the laboring course.

After Synchrony came Arklow, Channel Maker, Editore, Camelot Kitten, Kurilov, and Shining Copper.

The time for the 1 1/8 miles was 1:54.64, a very slow clocking indicative of the testing conditions.

Yoshida was bred by Northern Farm and is a son of Heart's Cry and the Canadian Frontier mare Hilda's Passion. Elliott Walden, president and chief executive of racing operations for WinStar, said he and bloodstock agent Tom Ryan traveled to Japan for a yearling sale in 2015, the first time Walden had made such a trip. At the sale, Walden discovered and purchased Yoshida.

"We just decided to go over there and look for some new blood," Walden said.

The trip to Royal Ascot was confirmed several days after the race by his owners.

It took a year, but Salty finally got her revenge on Abel Tasman on May 4 at Churchill Downs.

Salty was fifth behind the victorious Abel Tasman the first time they met in last year's Kentucky Oaks, and finished behind her in three subsequent starts last year, but in the Grade 1, \$350,000 La Troienne Stakes, Salty rallied up the rail and nailed pacesetting Farrell as Abel Tasman, making her first start in six months and hampered by a slow pace, finished fourth.

Salty (\$10.40) had a pair of preps around one turn this year after being off for more than five months, and the added distance of the 1 1/16-mile La Troienne certainly played in her favor. She sat second during the early going behind Farrell, then

finished best of all to prevail by 1 3/4 lengths.

Salty completed 1 1/16 miles on the fast main track in 1:43.78.

Farrell finished 1 1/4 lengths in front of third-place Martini Glass, who beat Abel Tasman, the 3-5 favorite, by a neck. Tiger Moth was fifth and Streamline trailed in the six-horse field.

Farrell was the lone speed in the race, and Tyler Gaffalione, who rode Salty, understood the task at hand. He wanted to keep Salty close, and had a willing participant in the scheme, as Salty was second in the early going.

"We needed to be closer," Gaffalione said. "She broke well and was fine being up there, and I didn't want to take anything away from her."

Channing Hill, who rode Farrell, got her to a clear lead through fractions of 24.70 seconds for the opening quarter, 48.86 seconds for the half, and 1:12.82 for six furlongs.

Abel Tasman, last year's champion 3-year-old filly, is always sluggish to begin her races. She was fifth in the early going and found herself behind a pace that did her no favors in her first start since last year's Breeders' Cup Distaff. Her jockey, Mike Smith, said he was afraid to try and advance inside, "because they all had eyes on me," and he was fearful of being boxed in. He said Paco Lopez, on Martini Glass, seemed particularly keen on trying to trap him.

Smith said Abel Tasman galloped out well after the race, and insisted to her trainer, Bob Baffert, that "she'll be fine."

The win by Salty was her fourth in 11 starts. Her biggest prior win was in her second start, in the Grade 2 Gulfstream Park Oaks 13 months ago. Salty, 4, is owned by a partnership that includes Gary Barber. She is trained by Mark Casse.

"We thought if there was ever a time to take on Abel Tasman, it was today," Casse said.

A two-pronged change in circumstances led to a change in outcome for American Gal in the Grade 1, \$300,000 Humana Distaff on the Kentucky Derby card.

Unlike in last month's Madison at Keeneland, where she returned from a layoff and ran fourth to Finley'sluckycharm after dueling inside that rival, this time American Gal didn't face those disadvantages. Fit off that comeback race and drawn outside Finley'sluckycharm, she ran back to the form she displayed in taking the Grade 1 Test last year, scoring in the Humana Distaff by two lengths over Ivy Bell.

Although American Gal and Finley'sluckycharm were heads apart early, as they were in the fast-paced Madison, a far more leisurely tempo unfolded in the Humana. They took turns on the lead for the opening quarter-mile and half-mile of the seven-furlong race, timed in just 23.03 seconds and 45.63.

These easy fractions were made possible in part by the draw and the tactics of winning rider Jose Ortiz, who kept her well off the rail down the backstretch, away from the competition. "I didn't want anyone putting pressure on me early," he said.

When Lewis Bay, the eventual third-place finisher, began to dial up pressure on the outside on the turn, the race turned into a sprint. American Gal surged clear to open up a two-length advantage in midstretch, with six furlongs in 1:09.58, and maintained that edge to the wire by completing seven-eighths in 1:22.23 over a sealed racetrack that Churchill Downs labeled "muddy."

"She trained really well going into the last race, but we'd seen a slight sort of improvement from that race, like the light switch came back on," winning trainer Simon Callaghan said.

A 4-year-old daughter of Concord Point owned by Kaleem Shah, she improved her record to five wins from eight starts with earnings of \$904,980. American Gal's only defeat in six sprints came in the Madison, where she was beaten a neck in a blanket finish. She paid \$7.80 as the third favorite in the field of seven.

Ivy Bell, who tracked the leaders in third or fourth for much of the race, finished well to grab second once securing running room from behind horses, though she never posed a significant threat to the winner.

Finley'sluckycharm, narrowly favored at 5-2, faded to fourth, losing for the first time in seven starts over the Churchill Downs strip.

Limousine Liberal retained his flair for the dramatic and his affinity for Churchill Downs on May 5 by outfinishing Warrior's Club and Awesome Slew to win the Grade 2, \$500,000 Churchill Downs Stakes by a head.

Warrior's Club, who beat Limousine Liberal by a neck in last month's Grade 3 Commonwealth Stakes at Keeneland, was second by a head over Awesome Slew on Saturday in a race run over a sloppy track.

This was the second straight year that Limousine Liberal won the Churchill Downs by a head, having beat Awesome Slew by that margin last year, also over a wet track. It was the seventh time in 21 career starts that Limousine Liberal was in a race where he won or was beaten by a nose, head, or neck.

"He's a fighter, man. He just wasn't going to get beat today," said Ben Colebrook, who trains Limousine Liberal for Katherine Ball.

Limousine Liberal, a 6-year-old gelding by Successful Appeal, rarely gets beat at Churchill Downs. He has six wins and one second-place finish in eight starts here. That could bode well for the fall as the Breeders' Cup will be held here in November.

"Obviously, he's got home-court advantage; they're going to have to run to beat him," Colebrook said.

They were doing some serious running in the Churchill Downs as Imperial Hint, the 6-5 favorite under Javier Castellano, set the pace of 22.10 seconds and 44.57 for the opening half-mile while being chased by Chief Cicatriz, Limousine Liberal, and Unbridled Outlaw.

Limousine Liberal, under Jose Ortiz, was fourth going into the turn and made a three-wide move to get into contention approaching the quarter pole. Limousine Liberal was within a half-length of Imperial Hint at the eighth pole, while Awesome Slew, who launched a bid entering the far turn, was flying outside under Irad Ortiz Jr.

Awesome Slew put his head in front of Limousine Liberal inside the eighth pole, but Limousine Liberal battled back to regain the lead and held the late-charging Warrior's Club at bay.

Limousine Liberal covered the seven furlongs in 1:22.73 and returned \$10.80 as the third choice.

Colebrook said he would consider the

Aristides here on June 2 or the True North at Belmont Park on June 8 for Limousine Liberal's next start.

Under the gaze of a massive crowd May 4 on Kentucky Oaks Day at Churchill Downs, a potential star shined bright while another faded from view in the Grade 2, \$400,000 Alysheba Stakes. Capturing the attention was Backyard Heaven, who stepped up from a first-level allowance to dominate stakes rivals, while disappointing was Always Dreaming, who lost for the fifth straight time since winning the Kentucky Derby a year ago.

As dazzling as Backyard Heaven was to observe, Always Dreaming was unfulfilling. The latter was able to set the pace without encouragement from regular rider John Velazquez, going an easy opening quarter in 23.86 seconds, followed by a half mile in 46.79. But as Backyard Heaven dialed up the pressure, hitting the front with six furlongs in 1:10.86, Always Dreaming was in retreat. He weakened to fifth, beaten 9 3/4 lengths.

"You hope the horses show up, and he hasn't shown up since the Derby," Velazquez said.

Meanwhile, it was all smiles among the Backyard Heaven camp after his 4 1/2-length Alysheba victory over long-shot Hawaakom — though it was a long time coming, after illness and other minor setbacks sidelined the horse until last September, two-thirds of the way into his 3-year-old year. It marked just his fourth start and his third straight win after a runner-up finish in his debut.

Ken Ramsey, who co-owns Backyard Heaven with his wife, Sarah, was in his usual jubilant mood while celebrating with relatives after the race. Asked for his thoughts, he responded, "I'm thinking Breeders' Cup Classic. I'm thinking Dubai World Cup, and that little race in between called the Pegasus."

Trainer Chad Brown has his eyes on other races in the immediate future, saying

he likely would gradually stretch Backyard Heaven in distance, mentioning 1 1/8-mile races such as the Grade 1 Stephen Foster at Churchill Downs on June 16 and the Aug. 4 Whitney at Saratoga as possibilities.

Backyard Heaven ran 1 1/16 miles in 1:41.73 on a fast track under Irad Ortiz Jr. and paid \$6.40 to win.

Some three hours before sending out four starters in the 144th Kentucky Derby, trainer Todd Pletcher again familiarized himself with a stroll to the Churchill Downs winner's circle — albeit the non-infield variety — after Maraud's huge effort from off the pace to dominate the Grade 2, \$300,000 American Turf on the Derby undercard.

Well-preserved early by John Velazquez over a grass course downgraded to yielding from day-long rain, Maraud launched a huge outside run to swamp the 13 other 3-year-olds in the 1 1/16-mile race. The bay son of Blame returned \$18.80 after finishing in 1:47.52.

Closers took all of the top spots, as Captivating Moon and Untamed Domain also finished strongly when settling for a dead heat for second, 1 1/2 lengths behind Maraud. Arawak was fourth, another half-length back.

Speed Franco set the pace in the 27th American Turf, followed closely by Inscom. After straightening away, as those early leaders faltered, River Boyne loomed as the lukewarm 3-1 favorite, but then the quick burst by Maraud put the issue to rest while the others followed him belatedly.

"I didn't think my horse liked the soft turf," Velazquez said. "I took a chance, took him back, and tried to make one run with him. He showed me something and came through for me. The turf is very, very soft now after all the rain."

Maraud, owned by the Treadway Racing Stable of Jeff Treadway, has won four of seven career starts. The Kentucky-bred colt was a two-back winner of the Grade 3 Palm Beach Stakes over the Gulfstream Park turf in March prior to finishing fifth in his most recent start behind Analyze It

in the April 6 Transylvania at Keeneland.

"At Keeneland he just didn't seem to handle the course, wasn't quite himself that day," Pletcher said. "We were concerned about the weather today and I'm glad we decided to take a shot. We'll probably take him back to New York and see what we have there. I'd love to make a race like the Belmont Derby," Pletcher said. The Belmont Derby is a \$1.2 million race on July 8 at Belmont Park.

Trainer Brendan Walsh admitted the steady rains that began falling about an hour before the \$300,000 Churchill Distaff Turf Mile on May 5 shook his confidence level just a bit regarding the chances of his two-time graded stakes winner Proctor's Ledge. But those worries proved unfounded after Proctor's Ledge parlayed a perfect trip under John Velazquez into a half-length victory over On Leave in the Grade 2 fixture for fillies and mares.

Proctor's Ledge came into the Distaff Turf Mile winless in three starts since registering a pair of graded stakes victories last summer at Saratoga. But two of those losses came in Grade 1 races, both at Keeneland, including the Jenny Wiley just three weeks earlier when she finished a non-threatening eighth while having her best chances compromised somewhat by a very wide trip.

But Proctor's Ledge wound up with a perfect run under Velazquez who angled her down into the two path while well placed in the run around the opening turn. Proctor's Ledge saved ground leaving the backstretch, eased out for the drive, and accelerated readily once settling into the stretch, ultimately running down On Leave near the sixteenth pole before edging away at the end.

On Leave stalked the early pace of the

outsider Psycho Sister, readily gained control a quarter-mile out, edged clear, but was unable to resist the winner when challenged. Dream Awhile, the tepid 7-2 favorite, rallied belatedly to finish third, a length behind On Leave, after being shuffled back some in traffic during the middle stages of the race.

Proctor's Ledge is a homebred daughter of **Ghostzapper** owned by Patricia Moseley. She returned \$15.80 to win after completing the mile over what was still labeled firm ground in 1:36.30.

Walsh said his main goal for Proctor's Ledge would likely be the Grade 1 Diana this summer at Saratoga.

Nearing the stretch, Ortiz angled out Pacific Wind four wide and began to advance. Highway Star came away with the lead entering the stretch and held about a 1 1/2-length advantage over Pacific Wind nearing the furlong pole.

But Pacific Wind proved the stronger of the two and edged away to a one-length victory.

"I broke good and got a nice trip," Ortiz said. "I waited there, just following horses. When I got in the clear, I asked her and she took off."

Pacific Wind stopped the timer in 1:36.22 and returned \$5 as the favorite in the five-horse field.

Highway Star held second by a half-length over Tequilita, who rallied from last. Faypien and Unchained Melody finished fourth and fifth.

The dawdling pace of the Sheepshead Bay at Belmont Park on May 5 worked against the late-running Holy Helena, but in the end, it didn't make any difference as she unleashed a torrid rally in the stretch to win the 1 3/8-mile turf race for fillies and mares.

The final eighth of the Grade 2, \$200,000 Sheepshead Bay went in 11.92 seconds, and Holy Helena was a little more than a length behind the front-running Palinodie passing the furlong pole. Holy Helena is now 3 for 3 since trainer Jimmy Jerkens switched her to turf for her 4-year-old season.

When the gates opened, Palinodie went to the front while appearing a bit headstrong, but jockey Trevor McCarthy quickly got her to settle down. She set fractions of 24.85 seconds, 50.24, and 1:15.86 with Lottie tracking her a length behind.

Following a mile in 1:41.20 and 1 1/4 miles in 2:04.23, Palinodie was still in front, but Lottie was rallying to her outside. Holy Helena, who was covered up to the stretch, was angled to the outside by jockey Manny Franco and found her best gear.

At the wire, Holy Helena was a half-length in front of Lottie. It was a nose farther back to 6-5 favorite Santa Monica, who raced in last position early and stayed to the inside for the drive. She worked her way between horses and, like the winner, was moving well late. Palinodie finished fourth, a half-length behind Santa Monica.

"She had to sprint down the lane to win it. She bobbed a little bit, too," Jerkens said. "These races are always very tricky when the horses all have the same style. Coming into it, I couldn't tell who was going to be on the lead or anything."

Holy Helena paid \$4.80 in the seven-horse field. She was timed in 2:15.15.

Holy Helena, a daughter of **Ghostzapper**, was bred in Canada by Adena Springs and is owned by Frank Stronach. She primarily had a synthetic campaign last year, defeating males in the Queen's Plate and beating fillies in the Woodbine Oaks.

"When it came time to go to Florida for the winter, we were talking, and it was, 'Well, should we turn her out for the winter? Try her back on the dirt? Go back to Canada?' " Jerkens said. "I said, 'We're going to Florida anyway, we might as well freshen her up a little bit, try her on turf, and see if she likes it. There's really nothing to lose.'"

Holy Helena won an optional-claiming race on turf at Gulfstream Park in February. She came back to take the Grade 3 The Very One in March.

Jerkens said he did not have a next race in mind for Holy Helena, but for the immediate future, he planned to keep her in longer filly-and-mare turf races.

Though Mia Mischief had rated nicely in her last race, the speedy 3-year-old filly came to the Churchill Downs paddock prior to the Grade 2 Eight Belles on May 4 at Churchill Downs with run on her mind.

“When she walked in the paddock – she’s a very strong mare, big – she was definitely on her toes,” trainer Steve Asmussen said. “No doubt she noticed there were a few more people in attendance when she walked over, and she was pretty aggressive.”

Mia Mischief took her aggression out on her six rivals in the \$200,000 Eight Belles, putting away the pace prompters Talk Veuve to Me and Amy’s Challenge to record a front-running 1 3/4-length score in the seven-furlong race for 3-year-old fillies.

Talk Veuve to Me, who was taken back off the pace after the opening quarter, finished second, well clear of Gas Station Sushi.

Mia Mischief, who won for the fourth time in seven starts, gave Asmussen his 7,997th career victory as a trainer.

Mia Mischief was coming off an 8 1/4-length victory in the Purple Martin Stakes at Oaklawn Park on March 24, sitting about two lengths off the early pace.

Under Ricardo Santana, Mia Mischief broke sharply in the seven-furlong race and was inside of Talk Veuve to Me through an opening quarter of 22.21 seconds. Gary Stevens then had Amy’s Challenge come up along the inside of Mia Mischief while Shaun Bridgmohan eased Talk Veuve to Me just off the front-runners, who went a half-mile in 44.21 seconds.

Turning for home, Talk Veuve to Me came outside of Mia Mischief, but with a few taps of Santana’s whip, Mia Mischief kept that rival at bay through the stretch.

Mia Mischief, a daughter of **Into Mischief** owned by William and Corinne Heiligbrodt, Sol Kumin’s Madaket Stables, and Scott Heider’s Heider Family Stables, covered the seven furlongs in 1:21.84 and returned \$5 as the favorite.

“She was really sharp,” Santana said. “She broke so good and then she relaxed a little bit. Turning for home she felt a horse on her side and she come back running.”

Asmussen said that his major target for Mia Mischief this summer will be the Grade 1, \$500,000 Test Stakes at Saratoga on Aug. 4, with a race or two before then.

On a waterlogged Derby Day at Churchill Downs, Funny Duck sank the chalk players, splashing home to an upset victory in the Grade 3, \$300,000 Pat Day Mile.

The **Distorted Humor** colt, who is trained by Rusty Arnold for Calumet Farm, returned \$81.40 on a \$2 win wager, and led home a parade of longshots in a deep field. New York Central finished second, a length ahead of Givemeaminit in third.

Grade 1 winner Sporting Chance finished fourth; Grade 2 winner Lombo finished sixth; the comebacking Mask, sent away as the favorite, was eighth for his first defeat; Mississippi, third in the Florida Derby last out, ninth; sharp Hutcheson Stakes winner Madison's Luna was 10th; Restoring Hope, third in the Wood Memorial, was 12th; and graded winner Greyvitos 13th. National Flag, who won the Bay Shore Stakes last out, was never a factor and finished last of 14.

Funny Duck's lone prior win in six starts came in a maiden race on the Gulfstream Park turf in February. He then finished seventh in the Grade 3 Transylvania Stakes last month at Keeneland.

In the Pat Day, Funny Duck, under Brian Hernandez Jr., stumbled slightly leaving the gate and settled to save ground in eighth as Lombo, under pressure from Greyvitos, took the field through a sharp opening half-

mile in 45.53 seconds. Funny Duck made up ground toward the inside and was rolling into the stretch, sitting third with a quarter-mile remaining as Hernandez tipped him out for running room. Meanwhile, the stalking New York Central had taken over and opened a length lead, but the eventual winner overhauled him to win going away.

"I think [the stumble at the break] worked to his advantage because then he got up and turned off for me," Hernandez said. "We were able to just find a nice smooth rail trip. We had to come around one horse, but he traveled like a winner the entire way."

Tale of Silence and Vulcan's Forge were the two longest-priced horses in the Grade 3 Westchester at Belmont Park on May 5. They were last, and second to last, early. But at the moment it counted, Tale of Silence came out on the right end of a four-horse blanket finish with Vulcan's Forge finishing second.

Conquest Big E was hustled to the front in the one-mile Westchester by jockey Jose Batista with come-backing Preakness winner Cloud Computing and Tommy Macho reserved early while racing second and third. It was a sizable gap back to 12-1 Tale of Silence in fourth with Vulcan's Forge a good distance farther back in last at 14-1.

Tommy Macho moved up under Tyler Gaffalione to press Conquest Big E on the far turn after a half-mile in 45.92, while jockey Manny Franco angled Cloud Computing to the outside and began to advance three wide.

Conquest Big E was finished at the top of the stretch as Cloud Computing and Tommy Macho hooked up eye to eye following six furlongs in 1:10.87. Tale of Silence

and Vulcan's Forge were beginning to make up ground with Trevor McCarthy taking Vulcan's Forge to the outside and Dylan Davis staying to the inside with Tale of Silence.

Vulcan's Forge and Tale of Silence steadily gained through the final furlong while Cloud Computing and Tommy Macho continued to fight it out, bumping several times in deep stretch.

Vulcan's Forge appeared to make the lead just before the wire but Tale of Silence won a tight head bob and a nose decision.

It was a nose back from Vulcan's Forge to Tommy Macho and another head back to Cloud Computing in fourth.

"We let him get comfortable and into his own stride," Davis said of Tale of Silence. "I knew it was hot up front.

"Turning for home there was a big gap down along the inside and he shot right for it, he didn't pay no mind. He knew what he had to do today."

Tale of Silence, owned by Charles Fipke and trained by Barclay Tagg, paid \$26.60 in the five-horse field. He was timed in 1:36.14.

Tale of Silence is 3 for 15 and the win broke a six-race losing streak.

"He likes this track. He likes that big wide turn," Tagg said. "One mile, one turn, that's his game.

Toinette finished full of run down the center of the course, wearing down the embattled leaders in the final strides to register a thrilling neck decision over the previously undefeated Rushing Fall in the \$200,000 Edgewood Stakes at Churchill Downs on May 4.

Toinette, a daughter of Scat Daddy trained by Neil Drysdale, was the least-experienced member of the field in the Grade 3 test for 3-year-old fillies, having made only three previous starts, none against stakes company. She had won both of her previous outings this season, including an entry-level allowance race at Keeneland just 23 days earlier.

Toinette got bumped at the break and was reserved near the rear of the pack by jockey Flavien Prat, about eight lengths off the early pace contested by Figarella's

Queen and Rushing Fall.

Toinette saved ground down the backstretch, eased off the rail into the stretch, came out a bit further near the furlong grounds while commencing her rally then surged late to run down the even-money Rushing Fall in the final strides.

Rushing Fall, a winner of all four previous starts, including the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf in her 2-year-old finale, disposed of Figarella's Queen and forged clear after five furlongs but was immediately engaged at that point by Daddy Is a Legend, the pair dueling on even terms until deep stretch.

Rushing Fall bravely fought off the challenge to gain a narrow advantage approaching the wire before ultimately succumbing to the winner's final surge while extremely game in defeat. Daddy Is a Legend finished a half-length farther back in third.

Toinette is owned in partnership by Ken Baca, Lisa and Nicholas Hawkins, and Lynne and Joseph Hudson. She completed 1 1/16 miles over a firm course in 1:41.70 and paid \$12.80 to win.

"She missed the break, but Prat didn't panic," Drysdale said. "She got a little stuck on the rails, but he was able to get her extricated.

"And she's got such a great turn of foot. When you ask her, boom, she goes."

Drysdale said he had a lot of confidence in Toinette to raise her up to a graded stakes off a first level allowance win.

"The race at Keeneland was a very strong race, what they call a 'hot race,' and she did that well, which is why we thought we could jump her into this," said Drysdale. "She's growing, so we'll probably back off a little and give her a breather now."

Will Call didn't even start in a grass race until this past December, and his stakes debut last month at Keeneland didn't work out at all, but Will Call won the Grade 3, \$200,000 Twin Spires Turf Sprint on May 4 at Churchill like he could be a force in the turf-sprint division the rest of the year.

Racing from farther off the pace than he'd ever been after breaking from post 9, Will

Call (\$15.60 to win) rallied into position at the top of the homestretch and closed the deal with a strong outside run through the final furlong. He and jockey Shaun Bridgmohan caught the leaders at the sixteenth pole and won going away, coming home 1 1/4 lengths in front of longshot Kid Perfect. Buccherio was another neck back in third, with the late-running filly Delectation a head farther back in fourth.

"From an outside post, I took a little hold of him before the turn and tried to maneuver my way into position," Bridgmohan said.

The tactics worked, as the pace horses backed up and Will Call got a clean run to the wire. After Restless Rambler, Riser, and Latent Revenge dueled through splits of 21.92 and 44.81 seconds, Will Call stopped the timer in 56.68 seconds for five furlongs on a firm turf course.

The victory was particularly satisfying for the Klein family, the Louisville natives who bred and own Will Call, a 4-year-old son of Country Day and the **More Than Ready** mare Vote Early. The Kleins also campaigned Country Day, Vote Early, and even Vote Early's dam, Mail It In.

That lineage goes back many years, but it was after Will Call won a third-level allowance race in January at Fair Grounds, running his turf record to two wins from two starts, that trainer Brad Cox, another Louisville native, thought he might have unearthed a real horse.

"When he won the 'three-other-than' at Fair Grounds, I thought it was a very solid group of horses he beat, and he beat them the right way. I thought that day this is going to be a stakes horse," Cox said.

Will Call was second to the talented turf sprinter Holding Gold while making his stakes debut in the Colonel Power on Feb. 17 at Fair Grounds, but he floundered over a soft course in the Shakertown Stakes at Keeneland last month, checking in a distant ninth.

"We had a lot of confidence in him going into the Keeneland race, and for whatever reason, it didn't work out that day," Cox said. "I really liked this horse coming into this race. His two works on this turf course had been fantastic. He broke off nice and easy, settled, and really fired home – just like he ran today."

Cox said it's reasonable to look to November and the Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint over the Churchill course with Will Call, and that in the shorter term, the Jaipur on Belmont Stakes Day seemed a logical option to consider.

Bee Jersey was an authoritative winner of the Grade 3, \$200,000 Steve Sexton Mile on May 6 at Lone Star Park, wiring the field for a 5 1/2-length win over the comebacking Girvin.

It was another neck back to Shotgun Kowboy in third.

The Steve Sexton Mile is the co-richest race of the meet. It pays tribute to the late racing executive who was part of the original management team of Lone Star.

Bee Jersey (\$4.20) won his third straight race and his first stakes. He broke well from an outside gate and was up by 1 1/2 lengths through an opening quarter in 23.91 seconds. Bee Jersey continued to maintain that advantage through an opening half-mile in 47.62 seconds and six furlongs in 1:11.97.

Bee Jersey then increased his advantage through the stretch, while covering the distance in 1:36.76.

"He took the lead easy," jockey Ricardo Santana Jr. said. "When he took the lead he was really nice and comfortable there, and he was waiting for the competition.

"Turning for home, when he felt horses on his side, he started running again."

Steve Asmussen, who on May 5 became the second trainer in history to reach 8,000 Thoroughbred wins in North America, trains Bee Jersey for breeder and owner Charles Fipke.

"I think he's going to be a fabulous miler," Asmussen said. "Obviously we'll speak with Mr. Fipke and his team and see what we need to do next, but I think there's big races in his future."

Bee Jersey began his win streak in a first-level allowance at a mile Jan. 20 at Oaklawn. He then won at the same distance in his next start, in an optional \$62,500 claiming allowance at Keeneland on April 14. He is a 4-year-old son of Jersey Town.

Girvin, the winner of last year's Grade 1 Haskell Invitational, was making his 4-year-old debut. He trailed through a half-mile, put in a determined run on the final turn and through the stretch.

"We were really pleased," trainer Joe Sharp said. "I expected there to be a little more pace to go with Bee Jersey. I think that these two horses are going to go on and

have a great year. We were really pleased with Girvin's comeback, closing into a slow pace, finishing. We were very, very pleased as a comeback race."

Bee Jersey earned \$119,000 for his win, his fourth from nine starts.

The 4-year-old filly Fault made her typical last-to-first move in the final half-mile of the Grade 3 Adoration, arriving at the finish with a half-length to spare over Shenandoah Queen at Santa Anita.

Fault (\$3.20) is unbeaten in three starts, all stakes, since joining trainer Phil D'Amato's stable over the winter. The streak began with a one-length victory in the Grade 2 Buena Vista Stakes on turf in February and continued with an easy win by 6 1/2 lengths in the Grade 1 Santa Margarita Invitational on dirt March 17.

Fault (\$3.20) is unbeaten in three starts, all stakes, since joining trainer Phil D'Amato's stable over the winter. The streak began with a one-length victory in the Grade 2 Buena Vista Stakes on turf in February and continued with an easy win by 6 1/2 lengths in the Grade 1 Santa Margarita Invitational on dirt March 17.

The \$100,345 Adoration Stakes was a bit more dramatic. Chasing a slow pace, Fault won by a narrow margin, even though jockey Giovanni Franco knew the filly has sharp acceleration.

"She was comfortable and I was comfortable," Franco said. "I'd ask her a little bit and she'd go. She's a really nice filly."

Mended, the winner of 10 consecutive races in 2017, set a modest pace of 24.16 seconds for the opening quarter-mile and 48.40 for a half-mile. At that point, Fault trailed by more than seven lengths, a margin that began to shrink on the turn.

With a wide rally, Fault was within two lengths of the front with a furlong to go.

"She started increasing her stride," Franco said. "When she got closer to those horses, I knew she'd get there in time."

Fault was timed in 1:44.84. The early pace spooked trainer Phil D'Amato.

"It didn't look too promising early," D'Amato said. "Giovanni knew to keep her on the outside and keep her momentum."

Shenandoah Queen, who won the restricted Tranquility Lake Stakes at Del Mar last August, finished a length in front of 7-1 Mended. La Force finished fourth.

Fault, by Blame, has won 6 of 16 starts. Owned by Agave Racing Stable and the Little Red Feather Racing partnership, Fault has earned \$618,795 in her career.

D'Amato said Fault will start in a Grade 1 for fillies and mares later this spring — the \$400,000 Beholder Mile here on June 2 or the \$750,000 Ogden Phipps Stakes at Belmont Park on June 9.

For the first time in her American career, Treasuring took the lead a quarter-mile into the Grade 3 Seniorita Stakes for 3-year-old fillies on turf at Santa Anita on May 5.

The strategy was the difference. For the second time in her career, Treasuring was a stakes winner.

Ridden for the first time by Brice Blanc, Treasuring (\$11.80 to win) repelled a persistent challenge from 6-1 Pursuing The Dream to win the \$100,690 Seniorita at a mile on turf by 1 1/2 lengths.

"Once I made the lead going into the turn, I felt her drop the bridle," Blanc said.

Treasuring dueled for the lead between Pursuing The Dream and May Girl in the first furlong before May Girl took a stalking position in third and Treasuring

moved in front of Pursuing The Dream. At that point, Blanc's confidence soared.

"She was better than when I was in the middle," Blanc said. "I thought it could backfire, but I wanted to do that rather than going head and head."

Treasuring set early fractions of 23.04 seconds for the opening quarter-mile and 46.47 for a half-mile, leading narrowly. She was timed in 1:35.43, winning for the fourth time in her 12-race career and for the first time in the United States.

In seven starts in England and Ireland last year, Treasuring's best result was a half-length win in the Group 3 Curragh Stakes at five furlongs on a yielding turf course in August. She led midway through that race and prevailed by a half-length.

"Some of her better races in Europe was when she was on the lead," Blanc said.

Treasuring was sent to trainer Simon Callaghan last fall, and had mixed results in her first four starts in this country. She was second in the China Doll Stakes at a mile on turf on March 10, but a troubled sixth in the Grade 3 Providencia Stakes at 1 1/8 miles on turf on April 7.

"She might be more of a typical miler," Blanc said. "It's hard to tell. Maybe the key is to be forwardly placed."

Owned by Qatar Racing, Treasuring has earned \$151,127. Bred in Great Britain Treasuring is by the [Teofilo](#) stallion Havana Gold.
